POLLUTION

The Earth, our home, is beginning to look more and more like an immense pile of filth. Pollution is produced by residue, including dangerous waste, much of it non-biodegradable, some highly toxic and radioactive, from homes and businesses, from clinical electronic and industrial sources. This can lead to toxins in local populations, often not known until people's

health has been affected. The throwaway culture means re-cycling is mostly not following the system of nature which absorbs and recycles. Our industrial system has not developed the ability to absorb and re-use waste and by-products. This issue which affects the entire planet, needs serious consideration; only limited progress has been made .
