URGENT REQUEST FROM ARCHBISHOP BERNARD LONGLEY

Do you support Catholic schools and the right of Catholics to send their children to them? Then we need you to make your voice heard. The Government is making a critical decision on whether to overturn the admissions cap which prevents Catholic schools from allowing all Catholic pupils to attend. They have acknowledged that this policy discriminates against Catholics and promised to abandon it, now we need you to tell them not to u-turn on their promise to Catholics. ST. STEPHEN'S GUILD MASS OF THANKSGIVING



GLOBAL INEQUALITY

Human society and the natural world deteriorate together and gravest effects are suffered by the poorest; we have to realize that concern for the environment must always include questions of justice "so as to hear both the cry of the earth and the cry of the poor. They are the majority of the planet's population; billions of people. They frequently remain at

the bottom of the pile, partly because opinion makers, communications media and the centres of power are located in affluent urban areas, far removed from the poor with little direct contact with their problems. (48-53)
