FATHER HUDSON'S CARE



THE MYSTERY OF THE UNIVERSE

In our Christian tradition, the word 'creation' has a broader meaning than 'nature'; it has to do with God's loving plan that sees every creature having its own value and significance. The world came about not from chaos or chance but because of a decision of love, to create order and a kind of 'universal communion'. This emphasises our duty as human beings, as part of the world, to develop our abilities in order to protect it and develop its potential. Nature is both valuable and fragile: it is this fragile world, entrusted by God to human care, that challenges us to devise intelligent ways to develop and limit our power. God, who wishes to work with us and who counts on our co-operation, can bring good out of the evil human beings

have done to his creation. It is the duty of the Church not only to remind everyone of the duty to care for nature but, as Pope Benedict XVI said "she must above all prevent mankind from self-destruction". (76 -83)
