### LAUDATE SI: THE GOSPEL OF CREATION

#### THE GAZE OF JESUS

Jesus took up the biblical faith in God the Creator, emphasising a fundamental truth: God is Father. Talking with his disciples, he often invited them to recognise the paternal relationship God has with all his creatures. Jesus lived in full harmony with creation, and others were amazed: "What sort of man is this, that even the winds and the sea obey him?" (Matthew 8:27). As a carpenter, Jesus worked with his hands, in daily contact with the matter created by God. Then the New Testament also shows him risen and glorious, present

throughout creation by his universal lordship, with the very flowers of the field and the birds which his human eyes contemplated and admired imbued with his radiant presence. This is the very essence of the *Gospel of Creation* Pope Francis asks us to proclaim and act upon. (96-100)
