DAY OF FASTING AND PRAYER FOR PEACE IN THE DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF THE CONGO, SOUTH SUDAN AND ALL THE WORLD

The Holy Father has announced that Friday 23rd February, the Friday of the First Week of Lent, has been designated as a Day of Fasting and Prayer. The Apostolic Nuncio has asked all the Bishops to make this as widely known as possible so that all our local churches can participate in the Papal initiative. This date is also CAFOD Family Lent Fast Day and so the Holy Father's request could dovetail into this annual work, especially as CAFOD has projects in both the Democratic Republic of the Congo and South Sudan. This Lent, your donation will make double the difference. For every pound you donate to CAFOD, the UK Government will also donate a pound, up to a total of £5 million, meaning twice the number of lives can be transformed. TECHNOLOGY DOMINATES ALL

The economy accepts every advance in technology with a view to profit with no concern for its negative impact on human beings. Some maintain that economics and technology will solve all environmental problems and argue that the problems of global hunger and poverty will be resolved simply by market growth. They have no interest in more balanced levels of production, better distribution of wealth, concern for the

environment and the rights of future generations. Their behaviour shows that for them maximising profits is enough. Yet by itself the market cannot guarantee integral human development and social inclusion. (109).
