#### **WAY OF THE CROSS: LENT 2018**

The Stations of the Cross are an ancient tradition in the Catholic Church going back to the fourth century when Christians went on pilgrimage to the Holy Land. Like many of our Catholic traditions, the Stations of the Cross are rich, deep and meaningful. They help us to understand the sufferings and passion of Jesus Christ and prepare ourselves for the great feast of the Resurrection. This year this traditional devotion is at 9.45 am, just after the Mass, on each Friday during Lent. In the last few years individuals and different Parish groups have offered to lead the reflection.
