The Stations of the Cross are an ancient tradition in the Catholic Church going back to the fourth century when Christians went on pilgrimage to the Holy Land. This year this traditional devotion is at 9.45 am, just after the Mass, on each Friday during Lent. The Stations of the Cross are also still in place outside the church.

HOLY WEEK LITURGIES


