Start a 'Blow Them Away' Committee

"The main thing we've been doing for preparing is building teams. I think this is a really incredible opportunity for the Church to empower leaders. I think people are very generous, they want to do something, they want to help. We have a hospitality team working on what's hospitality going to look like, a cleaning team... We're building teams to dream and think big and do it well. When you get into things like hospitality and cleaning and all of this, you have people who are really good at logistics and processes, and you really need that. But you also need to balance it with the visionary dreamers who are passionate about the people and the experience of returning. We have a 'Blow Them Away Committee' – people who are going to dream about signs 'Welcome Home!' Just embracing the experience. We're not just going back
