CHURCH OPEN FOR MASS

The normal Mass timetable has now resumed. Please check the website before attending Mass in church in case changes are made due to unforeseen circumstances. All are welcome to attend either Sunday, Saturday or weekday Masses. There will be stewards at the entrance to welcome you and at the exit to guide you. We want to make the effort to accommodate the maximum number people with social distancing in the church, however, the number in church is limited to 80. Holy Communion will be distributed only in hand in One Kind. Please follow the instructions from the stewards; they are there to help you. Thank you, Fr. George Mathew SCJ

NOTES FOR THOSE ATTENDING MASS

When coming to Mass on a Sunday, it would be helpful if you would please keep in mind the following:

- Wear a face covering unless you are in a category exempted by the UK Government. Please note that wearing of a face covering in places of worship is a legal requirement from Saturday 8th August. Details of those who are exempted by law can be found here.
- Make use of the hand sanitiser on entering.
- To sit on the R/H side of the church, access by way of the R/H side aisle. To sit on the L/H side of the church, access by way of the centre aisle.
- On entering an empty pew, pass to its far L/H end.
- A pew will accommodate 3 singletons or 1 singleton and 1 couple or families may make use of an entire bench.
- After Communion, return to your seat by way of the side aisle that is adjacent to your seat.
- At the end of Mass, stewards will indicate the order in which the congregation will leave the church. You do not have to leave immediately but remember that the cleaners have work to do before the next Mass.
- Please sanitise your hands on the way out.

APPEAL FOR VOLUNTEERS FOR STEWARDING

The church is now open for public Mass. We always need at least two volunteers as stewards in the church for each. Are you or members of your family or friends (must be over 18 years and under 70 years) able to be a steward in the church for the Mass you come to on Sundays and weekdays help us? The stewards are mostly needed before and after the Masses. That means you can attend the Mass whilst being a steward. If you can help us, please contact the parish office via email or by phone for more details. Unlike during private prayer, the stewards will not have to sanitise the pews after each use. Thank you to Caroline Healy for cleaning the pews after each use. Thank you very much to those who have already offered their time as stewards during Private Prayer and offered to continue their help. We still need more to join our team.

Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Apocalypse 11: 19 -12: 1-6, 10;

Psalm 44;

1 Corinthians 15: 45-51

Luke 1: 39-56

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

Do you believe?

Dear Brothers and Sisters, today's reading tells about trusting, having faith. It is about the fact that our God is there always with us even though we cannot see him, touch him, in times we feel that he seems to be not caring, not seeing us. In the first reading we see Elijah having a similar experience, at the peak of his crisis. After killing 450 prophets of Bal, he is on the run for his life. Yes, Jezebel is after him, but we see God intervenes, feeds him. Finally, Elijah meets God in a gentle breeze and God consoles him.

St. Paul in the second reading feels the burden of human suffering. He speaks of the great sorrow and unremitting agony. But he feels the consolation of Christ's presence. In the gospel, we have the story of Jesus' walking on the water. When Matthew narrates this incident, Christian persecution had already started. The boat here represents the Church, assaulted by temptations, trials and persecutions. Thus, the story of the storm is the story of struggle, danger, and fear experienced by the early Christians. Jesus appears as the Saviour, to save the people who call on him in faith. There are storms in our lives too; storms of sorrow, doubt, tension and uncertainty, storms of anxiety and worries, anger and despair, storms of temptations. We grumble and wail; "I can't go on anymore", "I have hit the rock bottom", "I see no more hope of living", etc. But the Lord is with us; he never abandons us. His presence gives us peace even in the wildest storms of life. It is true, we are unable to save ourselves. But the power of God can save us.

The question is not how big our problem is! But it is, how great is our God who saves us! Yes, without him, we can do nothing; without him we fail. As St. Paul says "but we can do all things in him who strengthens us". Peter expresses this leap of faith and trust when he jumps into the water. But for a moment he takes his eyes off the Saviour. For a moment he focuses on the depth of the sea and its dangers. He cries out in fear as he was near sinking point: Lord save me! and the Lord rescues him reaching out his hand of love. In our own discipleship of the Lord, the moment we take our gaze off the Lord, get distracted about the storms of life, we begin to sink. Let this Eucharist increase our faith in the power and presence of Jesus in our life and enable us to gaze on to him and trust in his loving care. May God bless us.
