CHURCH OPEN FOR MASS

The normal Mass timetable has now resumed. Please check the website before attending Mass in church in case changes are made due to unforeseen circumstances. All are welcome to attend either Sunday, Saturday or weekday Masses. There will be stewards at the entrance to welcome you and at the exit to guide you. We want to make the effort to accommodate the maximum number people with social distancing in the church, however, the number in church is limited to 80. Holy Communion will be distributed only in hand in One Kind. Please follow the instructions from the stewards; they are there to help you. Thank you, Fr. George Mathew SCJ

NOTES FOR THOSE ATTENDING MASS

When coming to Mass on a Sunday, it would be helpful if you would please keep in mind the following:

- Wear a face covering unless you are in a category exempted by the UK Government. Please note that wearing of a face covering in places of worship is a legal requirement from Saturday 8th August. Details of those who are exempted by law can be found <u>here</u>.
- Make use of the hand sanitiser on entering.
- To sit on the R/H side of the church, access by way of the R/H side aisle. To sit on the L/H side of the church, access by way of the centre aisle.
- On entering an empty pew, pass to its far L/H end.
- A pew will accommodate 3 singletons or 1 singleton and 1 couple or families may make use of an entire bench.
- After Communion, return to your seat by way of the side aisle that is adjacent to your seat.
- At the end of Mass, stewards will indicate the order in which the congregation will leave the church. You do not have to leave immediately but remember that the cleaners have work to do before the next Mass.
- Please sanitise your hands on the way out.

APPEAL FOR VOLUNTEERS FOR STEWARDING

The church is now open for public Mass. We always need at least two volunteers as stewards in the church for each. Are you or members of your family or friends (must be over 18 years and under 70 years) able to be a steward in the church for the Mass you come to on Sundays and weekdays help us? The stewards are mostly needed before and after the Masses. That means you can attend the Mass whilst being a steward. If you can help us, please contact the parish office via email or by phone for more details. Unlike during private prayer, the stewards will not have to sanitise the pews after each use. Thank you to Caroline Healy for cleaning the pews after each use. Thank you very much to those who have already offered their time as stewards during Private Prayer and offered to continue their help. We still need more to join our team.

Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Isaiah 22: 19 –23; Psalm 137; Romans 11: 33-36 Matthew 16: 13-20 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

Assumption Of Blessed Virgin Mary

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. In order to understand the meaning of this dogma; this is one of the four dogmas which Church holds regarding blessed Virgin Mary. The four dogmas are Mary is the Mother of God, Mary was Immaculately conceived that means without any original sin, Mary was perpetually a virgin and finally that Mary was totally assumed into Heaven. Of these dogmas the central dogma is that Mary is the Mother of God. Mary was preserved from original sin because she is the mother of God, Mary is perpetually virgin because she wanted to be totally available to God and Mary's Assumption or glorification is the result of being Mother of God.

So, having said that we may have to go back to the history of the dogma of the Assumption. In the Bible we don't find anything about the Assumption of Mary. The Gospels and the Pauline letters speak about how Jesus rose from the dead in 1 Corinthians 15 and it will speak also about how the Christians are destined to rise from the dead; nothing about Mary. So how did this dogma emerge if there is no Scriptural background? It emerged in a very interesting way, for instance you will find that even though there is nothing said about Mary, the Christian community felt that since she is mother of God, there is something special about the end of Mary. Then there was a big controversy about Mary. Did Mary die? Or was she taken straight up to heaven? The issue is not settled; because one group said Mary died; after all her Son Jesus died even though He was Son of God, why can't Mary die? Others said, 'death is the result of sin'; Mary has no sin, so she has taken up to heaven. Thus, this dogma was first celebrated liturgically in the east in the 6th century: The Feast of Falling Asleep of Mary. Later it came to the west. When in the east the Falling Asleep of Mary was celebrated on 15th August, the west called it the Assumption. So, it was celebrated all over the world and on 1st of November in 1950, Pope Pius XXII in a solemn document defined that, "The Blessed Virgin May, when the course of her earthly life was ended was taken up body and soul into heaven".

What does the dogma telling us? It tells us that the final state of redemption, when we redeemed both body and soul has begun already in Jesus Christ, yes, but in one more person is the Blessed Virgin Mary. And so, it tells us what is the destiny each one of us. Mary is the sign and a mode of each one of us are called to be. The destiny and mission of each one of us is to present Jesus Christ to the world. So, what Mary presented in a unique way has to take place in our life too. As the dogma of the immaculate conception states we need to be free from sin so in Mary is realised what each one of us are called to be. To be available to God. Finally, the Assumption of Mary as she is taken up in body and soul to Heaven; so, that is the destiny of each one of us. So, the glorification of Mary shows what our on glorification going to be.

May the Blessed Virgin Mary help us to be like her to imitate Christ. Amen.
