CHURCH OPEN FOR MASS

The normal Mass timetable has now resumed. Please note that there will be Holy Communion Services on Friday 28th & Saturday 29th August. All are welcome to attend either Sunday, Saturday or weekday Masses. There will be stewards at the entrance to welcome you and at the exit to guide you. We want to make the effort to accommodate the maximum number people with social distancing in the church, however, the number in church is limited to 80. Holy Communion will be distributed only in hand in One Kind. Please follow the instructions from the stewards; they are there to help you. Thank you, Fr. George Mathew SCJ

NOTES FOR THOSE ATTENDING MASS

When coming to Mass on a Sunday, it would be helpful if you would please keep in mind the following:

- Wear a face covering unless you are in a category exempted by the UK Government. Please note that wearing of a face covering in places of worship is a legal requirement from Saturday 8th August. Details of those who are exempted by law can be found here.
- Make use of the hand sanitiser on entering.
- To sit on the R/H side of the church, access by way of the R/H side aisle. To sit on the L/H side of the church, access by way of the centre aisle.
- On entering an empty pew, pass to its far L/H end.
- A pew will accommodate 3 singletons or 1 singleton and 1 couple or families may make use of an entire bench.
- After Communion, return to your seat by way of the side aisle that is adjacent to your seat.
- At the end of Mass, stewards will indicate the order in which the congregation will leave the church. You do not have to leave immediately but remember that the cleaners have work to do before the next Mass.
- Please sanitise your hands on the way out.

Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Jeremiah 20: 7 – 9; Psalm 62;

Romans 12: 1-2

Matthew 16: 21-27

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

Do I know him?

I am sure most of you have watched Mel Gibson's movie The Passion of Christ. Lucca Lionello the actor who played Judas in this movie is a good example of how God intervenes in our life in a mysterious way. Lucca grew up Catholic, but after confirmation he stopped going to Mass and left his faith behind. By the time he started working on The Passion, he was a confirmed and convinced atheist living in an irregular marriage with an un-baptized daughter. While filming the scene where Judas gave in to despair and took his own life, Lucca had to think deeply how to portray a person that was torn apart by sin and separated from friendship with God. He could not get it out of his mind, even after the scene was finished and all the filming was done. A few months later, during post-production process, he saw a priest near the sound studio, began a conversation, which eventually led him to return to the Sacraments, rectified his marriage, and baptized his nine-year-old daughter.

God uses the role of Judas to bring a prodigal son back home. Hence, no surprises why Jesus entrusts his Church, his mission, to Peter – the man he knew would certainly deny him three times, though out of fear. Jesus knew deep beneath that fear, Peter had a heart filled with love. My dear friends, God's ways may seem weird to the human mind. That does not mean that our response to Him can also be weird. No, our response to God should be one of humble submission to his plan. We have ample number of ways by which we can know about God, about Jesus, about Scripture and about spirituality. I may have a doctorate in theology and in scripture. But that does not necessarily guarantee that I know God, Jesus and his Words. Only the one who in humble submission seek for him in will Know Him. This humble submission is possible only through a personal experience of God. Jesus knew his Father, so was able to surrender himself to His plan. Peter was able to articulate his personal experience of Jesus saying, "you are the Christ, the anointed one, the Messiah". He did it with conviction. What is our personal conviction about Jesus? Are we able to articulate our experience of Jesus and confess our faith in him as Peter did?. Our faith in Jesus, and our submission to His plans opens up our hearts to him even as He does His to us.

It is good to remember the times when Jesus said to the people he healed, "Your faith has healed you." (Mt 9:22, Mk 5:34, 10:52, Lk 7:50). Because of their FAITH, because they opened their hearts to God, Jesus was able to act on them. It's only such a FAITH will enable us to fight the evil one. As Jesus said, "the gates of hell shall not prevail against you." We know both Judas and Peter sinned. Both disowned Jesus. Both repented too. (Mt 27:3). Only peter returned to the Lord. That is why Peter is the rock on which the Church is founded. The Church was founded on Peter, who loved, and sinned, and held on to the Lord anyway. The gates of Hell cannot prevail against this kind of love.

May God grant us a deep faith that comes from our personal experience of Him.
