CHURCH OPEN FOR MASS

The normal Mass timetable has now resumed. Please check the newsletter and website for any changes to the Mass timetable. All are welcome to attend either Sunday, Saturday or weekday Masses.

NOTES FOR THOSE ATTENDING MASS

When coming to Mass on a Sunday, it would be helpful if you would please keep in mind the following:

- Wear a face covering unless you are in a category exempted by the UK Government. Please note that wearing of a face covering in places of worship is a legal requirement from Saturday 8th August. Details of who exempted law those are bv can be found at https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/face-coverings-whento-wear-one-and-how-to-make-your-own/face-coverings-when-towear-one-and-how-to-make-your-own.
- Make use of the hand sanitiser on entering.
- To sit on the R/H side of the church, access by way of the R/H side aisle. To sit on the L/H side of the church, access by way of the centre aisle.
- On entering an empty pew, pass to its far L/H end.
- A pew will accommodate 3 singletons or 1 singleton and 1 couple or families may make use of an entire bench.
- After Communion, return to your seat by way of the side aisle that is adjacent to your seat.
- At the end of Mass, stewards will indicate the order in which the congregation will leave the church. You do not have to leave immediately but remember that the cleaners have work to d& before the next Mass.
- Please sanitise your hands on the way out.

Next Sunday's Mass Readings Ecclesiasticus 27: 30 – 28: 7; Psalm 102; Romans 14: 7-9 Matthew 18: 21-35 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

Aren't we the keepers of our Brothers & Sisters?

On this 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time, the Lord directs our attention to fraternal correction, a difficult but an important aspect of our Christian life. We cannot just overlook or deny the reality and the need to correct mistakes and mend broken relationships. Are there people you need to correct? Are there truths you need to point out? The truth hurts, and the process of pointing out the truth is painful, but the truth does set us free. Jesus offers us a pattern for fraternal correction. He says, in the Gospel Matthew 18:15-18. When the first three steps of corrections fail, the fourth and the 'last solution' in the art of fraternal correction is highlighted by Jesus as a model for us to follow.

People easily misinterpret this forth step. What Jesus exhorts us is not to exclude the person from the community. People easily misinterpret this forth step. To understand this teaching all that we need is to remember how Jesus treated a pagan or a tax collector or a sinner. Did he exclude or reject them? No, never. On the contrary, he loved them with all his heart. He welcomed them, listened to them and treated them with generosity, respect and compassion. He willingly shared their joys and pains. This is what Jesus invites us to learn and practice in our life too. This fourth step thus becomes the climax of the art of fraternal correction. When all our efforts to correct the wrongdoer fail, the greatest and most valuable correction is our enduring love for him/her. The basic goal of fraternal correction is to help free the wrong doer from his difficulties and not to cause more wounds to an already broken soul. Let us ask Jesus to help us to be more sympathetic with the weaknesses of others. Let us learn to practice the art of fraternal correction by growing in our love for one another.

Unfortunately, there are far too many Christians today who pay no heed to the serious obligation of encouraging an erring brother to give up his sinful ways. They shrug it off by saying: "I have more than enough to do to keep myself from sin" or "am I my brother's keeper"? The answer is in this lesson we have just read. We are our brothers' keepers, and even if we have many temptations and inclinations to sin, we shall not overcome them if we have no time to think of our neighbours' need. Let each one of us introspect our past conduct in relation to this law of charity. Have we really tried to help our fellowmen/women on the road to heaven? Have we given them the good example of a truly Christian way of living? Have we offered advice and encouragement when it was needed, and correction in private where that was possible? If so "we have gained our brother/sister." We have brought a prodigal son/daughter back to a loving Father and that loving Father will repay us a hundred-fold in this life and especially in the next.
