NOTES FOR THOSE ATTENDING MASS

When coming to Mass on a Sunday, it would be helpful if you would please keep in mind the following:

- Wear a face covering unless you are in a category exempted by the UK Government. Please note that wearing of a face covering in places of worship is a legal requirement from Saturday 8th August. Details of those who are exempted by law can be found at https://www.gov.uk/government/publications/face-coverings-whento-wear-one-and-how-to-make-your-own/face-coverings-when-towear-one-and-how-to-make-your-own.
- Make use of the hand sanitiser on entering.
- To sit on the R/H side of the church, access by way of the R/H side aisle. To sit on the L/H side of the church, access by way of the centre aisle
- On entering an empty pew, pass to its far L/H end.
- A pew will accommodate 3 singletons or 1 singleton and 1 couple or families may make use of an entire bench.
- After Communion, return to your seat by way of the side aisle that is adjacent to your seat.
- At the end of Mass, stewards will indicate the order in which the congregation will leave the church. You do not have to leave immediately but remember that the cleaners have work to d∂ before the next Mass.
- Please sanitise your hands on the way out.

Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Isaiah 55: 6 – 9; Psalm 144;

Philippians 1: 20-24, 27

Matthew 20: 1-6

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

How many times Must I Forgive?

My dear brothers and sisters, The Word of God today revolves around the theme 'FORGIVENESS'. The first reading says that "Anger and wrath are abominations" and that by keeping grudge against others, we cannot pray and we cannot ask the Lord for healing. In the Gospel, presuming that forgiving seven times was a gesture of generosity, Peter asks Jesus, "Lord, how often shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? As many as seven times?" Jesus' response is very surprising and demanding. Jesus said, "I do not say to you seven times, but seventy times seven". Forgiveness, first of all, presupposes the nature of human beings to be in relationship with others. Human beings are created to live in good relationship with one another and with the whole universe. Our every attempt go against this divine plan will result in a miserable, unbearable and unproductive life. And forgiveness is indispensable part of human relationship. Forgiveness, secondly, presupposes human weakness, that is, we easily get hurt and we hurt others. Sometimes we hurt others intentionally. Forgiveness, thirdly, presupposes our sensitive nature. We are not merely people of reason, but also people of feelings and emotions.

The readings of today portray some of the reasons for forgiving and seeking forgiveness. The first reason: We forgive and we seek forgiveness more for ourselves than for God and for others. In fact, the heaviest burdens that we carry within us are grudge, resentment and hatred. These burdens do more harm to us than towards whom we hold them. Forgiveness gives us the freedom and vitality to live a more serene and happy life. Forgiving, we experience the healing of body and mind. By forgiving, we take control of our lives. While lack of forgiveness equates us with animals, forgiveness makes us more humane and divine.

Secondly, by forgiving and seeking forgiveness, we admit and we proclaim that relationship is more important than the hurt feelings that we have experienced. Thirdly, the experience of forgiveness makes us free and joyful, so does it create the same effect in others.

Again the readings of today offer us certain tips to forgive. First, remember the 'end of our life': We are here on earth as pilgrims; we should not be foolish and imprudent to waste this brief but precious time with negativity. Second, remember the rule that the "measure in which we forgive is the measure in which we are forgiven". Thus, we experience healing and wholeness in our lives. Third, consider the fact that "the Lord has forgiven us, and hence, we must forgive"; we have received without pay, and we must give without pay. Therefore, dear friends, understand today the need to forgive and the need to seek forgiveness; do it without any condition, and your experience of wholeness, enthusiasm, peace and joy will be boundless.
