COVID-19: KEEPING CONTACT DETAILS OF THOSE ATTENDING MASS

Government guidance for the safe use of places of worship states that churches should assist NHS Track and Trace by keeping a record of those who come to church. With effect from Sunday 27th September we will be keeping details of those who attend Mass. Only one name and telephone number will be needed per group. If you decline to provide this information, you can still attend Mass. If NHS Track and Trace contacts the parish, details of those who attended the relevant Mass will be provided. Information will be destroyed after 21 days. In addition, QR codes for use with the NHS Covid-19 app are also on display outside and inside the church. Please note that these are different for the Church and Hall so please ensure that you scan the code with Sacred Heart Church written underneath.

NOTES FOR THOSE ATTENDING MASS

When coming to Mass on a Sunday, it would be helpful if you would please keep in mind the following:

- Wear a face covering unless you are in a category exempted by the UK Government.
- Make use of the hand sanitiser on entering.
- To sit on the R/H side of the church, access by way of the R/H side aisle. To sit on the L/H side of the church, access by way of the centre aisle. On entering an empty pew, pass to its far L/H end.
- A pew will accommodate 3 singletons or 1 singleton and 1 couple or families may make use of an entire bench.
- After Communion, return to your seat by way of the side aisle that is adjacent to your seat.
- At the end of Mass, stewards will indicate the order in which the congregation will leave the church. Please sanitise your hands on the way out.

Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Isaiah 5: 1–7; Psalm 79;

Philippians 4: 6-9

Matthew 21: 33-43

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

Do I say yes to my God?

This is the 26th Sunday of the Ordinary Time. The Liturgy of the word places before us some important lessons for our consideration and follow up action. The Prophet Ezekiel speaks of his mission to tell the house of Israel that they are at fault that they need to change their ways instead of saying that the Lord's ways are unjust. Yahweh made a covenant to the people of Israel: "I shall be your God and you shall be my people". To enjoy the status, the people had to remain faithful, keeping the commandments and statutes that Yahweh taught them. Though God remained faithful and unchanging, when their wrong doings brought disaster on them, they developed a belief that God is not fair, God is cruel and that He is not a just God. When people experienced the consequences of their own wrong-doings they began to believe that God punished them. Not only they were punished, but God punished generations after them. It was as if they believed that punishment was inherited. Such a belief was prevalent even during the time of Jesus: People believed that sickness, any tragedy or any evil they encountered was due to sin or due to God's anger.

My dear Brothers and Sisters, God does not punish anyone but respects the free will he has bestowed on his children; on you and me, to make responsible choices and decisions and also to accept the consequences of our own decisions. He doesn't wish any misfortune would happen to us because He is full of love and mercy. If it is the case, why we suffer from misfortunes? We are all under the watchful care and protection of God; when we go against God because of our sins, we break the relationship with God and thus break away from His watchful care and protection. That means we become vulnerable to the world and it's dangers just like a chick being separated from the mother hen become vulnerable to its predator. At the same time, God is an unconditional lover; so, at any time if we realise our fault, repent and turn to him, we shall live and save our life.

The first lesson: God is telling us that although our sins deserve punishment, His plan for us is that we all be saved. That is Good News for us unworthy Children of God. The second lesson for today is indicated in the Parable of the two sons in the Gospel Mt 21:28-32 .The Parable indicates that God saves everyone who says "Yes" to him both with their lips and with their deeds. Promise is not enough; performance is equally necessary. We all are invited to the kingdom of God and we need to respond positively to this invitation, we need to EARN it. Our profession of faith without corresponding action will wither away. Therefore, what shall we take home this Sunday. First: We shall never blame God for our failures to live as children of God. Second: We shall practice what we profess. Our promises and corresponding performances are equally important in life. Thirdly: We shall take Jesus as our model and example, whom we imitate in our life. May God bless us.
