COVID-19: KEEPING CONTACT DETAILS OF THOSE ATTENDING MASS

Government guidance for the safe use of places of worship states that churches should assist NHS Track and Trace by keeping a record of those who come to church. With effect from Sunday 27th September we will be keeping details of those who attend Mass. Only one name and telephone number will be needed per group. If you decline to provide this information, you can still attend Mass. If NHS Track and Trace contacts the parish, details of those who attended the relevant Mass will be provided. Information will be destroyed after 21 days. In addition, QR codes for use with the NHS Covid-19 app are also on display outside and inside the church. Please note that these are different for the Church and Hall so please ensure that you scan the code with Sacred Heart Church written underneath. From Sunday 4th October there will be a tick list for Sunday Masses to speed up the process of taking contact details. If you provide you name to a steward then you are giving your consent to details already held for NHS Track and Trace within the 21 day time period being kept for a further 21 days from the date of this Mass. If your name is not on the list it could be because either 21 days has expired since you last gave details or you have not provided your details before.

Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Apocalypse 7: 2-4, 9-14;

Psalm 23;

1 John 3: 1-3,

Matthew 5: 1-12

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

Love of God and love of neighbour

My dear friends, today's gospel speaks about relationships. The basic principle of human life is love and on this principle of love is founded every religion in the world. Love has two sides, love of God and love of neighbour. Jesus tells us, you shall love the Lord your God. The word 'your' speaks about a personal relationship. Jesus summarises the whole Decalogue into two basic principles: "Loving God and loving our fellow human being". He further emphasizes that, "you must love God with all your being, i.e. with all your heart, with all your soul and with all your mind and love one's neighbour as oneself".

A loving and true relationship between persons does not allow lustful and disrespectful behaviour with others. True love involves commitment and loyalty with one another and trust and respect for the person loved. It is loving the person just for who he/she is. In the same way when we love God, we love God for Himself because He is who He is. We love him because he is the creator and sustainer of life, we love him because he is the saviour and redeemer of souls, we love him because he is the owner of our lives.

In the second point, Jesus says, "Love your neighbour as yourself." (Lv 19:18) A profession of love without action is incomplete. This is beautifully explained in the first letter of John 4:20-21, "If anyone says, "I love God", while he hates his brother, he is a liar, how can he love God whom he does not see, if he cannot love his brother whom he can see." He has given us this command, "whoever loves God must also love his brother." The great commandment to love God flows downwards into another great commandment, to love our neighbour as ourselves. Jesus says, "If anyone loves Me, he will keep My word. My Father will love him, and we will come to him and make Our home with him" John 15:10.

Without loving God and our fellow human being, we cannot keep the commandments. How do I manifest my love for God and my fellow human being in relation to following the commandments? If I love God: I will accept Him as my Lord and Saviour, and in humble surrender to His will I spend my time with him and for Him; neither will I let Him down through my actions or omissions nor I will use His name in vain; I will deal with my parents, elders and others and treat them with due respect; I will value every life as precious and I will honour it and protect it. If I love my fellow human being: I will not treat them as an object to assuage my desires rather I will respect them with dignity. I will not wish for other's possessions of any kind and will not be a fabulist. The sum and substance of all that God has said and done is love, and the sum and substance of all that God wants, is also love, in short, love of God and love of neighbour. God bless you.
