Am I ready to Meet Jesus?

Dear Friends in Christ Jesus. Nearly 2,000 years ago, Jesus spoke the parable of the ten virgins. For many, it is a nice Bible story about lamps, oil and getting ready for a wedding; yet the parable is actually a warning about conditions that will exist in our society at the end of the age. The target audience is the generation that will see the return of Jesus Christ! The parable is linked with prophecies about the last days that are coming to pass today. We need to be wise to understand it.

In today's first reading taken from the book of Wisdom we hear that God offers wisdom to us, but God does not force His way. Therefore, it is wisdom from God only that can help us understand His word and follow it. How does the parable relate to us. What can we learn from the parable of the ten virgins? We first need to consider who are the ten virgins? The parable pictures ten virgins who go out to meet the bridegroom (Jesus Christ). Many Bible scholars have simply described the ten virgins as the Christian community. Christians today certainly expect the Messiah to return. We are told that five of the virgins were wise and five were foolish. Just what does it mean to be wise, or foolish? How does the Bible define these terms? Into which category do we fall? Jesus explains that the wise are those who not only listen to His teachings, but actually follow those teachings. Jesus defines a foolish person as one who hears but does not follow the word of God! Foolish people make up reasons and excuses why the commandments and instructions of Scripture no longer apply to us today.

The book of Proverbs provides additional definitions for example a wise person will seek advice and listen to correction (Pro. 10:8), but fools ignore advice and resent correction (Pro. 14:16). A fool reacts to situations with immediate anger, yet a wise person ignores insults and exercises self-control (Pro. 12:16). The lamps of the ten virgins illustrate another important lesson. The lamps of the wise virgins who brought oil were burning brightly. Filled with oil, these lamps were able to be a light to the world, fulfilling Christ's expectations for His chosen disciples (Mat. 5:13-16). If we are nourishing God's Spirit, others will see in our lives the fruits of love, obedience, faith and good works. Regrettably, the lamps of the foolish virgins were going out because they were running out of oil, absence of God's Spirit. If we begin to compromise the truth of God, and begin to ignore or disobey His laws and instructions, we begin to lose the Spirit of God. The fruits of God's Spirit will begin to disappear, and will be replaced by self-centred thoughts and actions that are often vain and ugly (Gal. 5:19-21). Sexual sins, arguments and divisions will thrive. Individuals who let their lamps get into this condition will not participate in the wedding and will not fulfil their calling to become first fruits in God's Kingdom. This is a serious warning! What is the condition of your lamp? Is it burning brightly, or is it going out? If you are not sure, ask God to show you the condition of your lamp, and be ready to listen to His answer.

A sobering lesson of the parable is that the wise virgins couldn't help the foolish ones with their oil or their oil would get over. This teaches us that whatever amount of faith, courage, character, conviction, good works or degree of conversion you have achieved, it cannot be loaned, shared, given to or borrowed by someone else! Hence at the end time we also cannot expect others to help us because they will not be able to do so. The final lesson of the parable is that we should be ready anytime when Jesus returns. Those who are ready will be invited to take part in the wedding. Those who are not ready will miss out, even though they hoped to be included in the celebrations! Let us be ready always by our good works. God bless you.
