COVID-19

Further to the new restrictions effective from Wednesday 2nd December, Mass will be open to the public from this date onwards. All previous rules and guidance for attending Mass safely will be still in place. Please note that taking details for track and trace purposes will also resume.

MASSES FOR CHRISTMAS EVE AND CHRISTMAS DAY 2020

There will be three Masses this year; Christmas Eve 5.00 pm (family Mass) and 8.00 pm and Christmas Day 9.00 am. As COVID-19 restrictions will still be in place the maximum capacity of the Church is only 80 worshippers at each Mass. Normally at Christmas, each Mass would be at least double this number. In order to alleviate any potential capacity problems, entry to all the above Masses will be by ticket only. Please can you contact Fr George (by telephone or by email) or Kate, parish secretary (by email only: sacredheartdroitwich@hotmail.co.uk since she is working from home) if you would like to attend Mass over this period. Alternatively, you can let one of the Stewards know at the Sunday or weekday Masses you attend when public services resume after 2nd December. To help us to organise the liturgy in advance, the last day for the booking will be Friday 18th December. The information required will be your name, contact telephone number, the number of people that will be in your group and the Mass you would like to attend. This information will be put on a ticket that you can collect either from the Stewards at your regular Mass or from Fr George. The ticket can be posted to you as long as you have given a mailing address. Please be aware that if demand is high enough there will be 80 worshippers in Church for each Mass and it is important for the safety of all that you sit in the seat allocated on your ticket and do not move to a different seat. An additional Mass will be added if these three Masses are oversubscribed. Further information will be in the Newsletter once the numbers wishing to attend Christmas Masses are known. Currently there are still over 30 places left at the 5.00 pm Mass and over 50 places left at the 8.00 pm and 9.00 am Masses.

Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Isaiah 61: 1-2, 10-11 Luke 1: 1; 1 Thessalonians 5: 16-24 John 1: 6-8, 19-28 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

He Comes to save us all.

Our God is coming. He is coming to save and redeem. The time of exile - the long separation of humankind from God, from one another and from nature because of sin - is about to end. This is the good news proclaimed in today's Gospel.

The first reading from the Book of Isaiah offers us hope, comfort, consolation, healing of body and mind with coming of Christ the Saviour into our hearts and homes. The Advent is all about expectation and preparation. Like people who eagerly awaited for the promised messiah in joy and hope, we too prepare ourselves and wait for Christ's glory to be revealed in our lives. This season of waiting brings us very particular joy and hope against all difficult and challenging situations you and I are living. In most problematic condition, we need to remind ourselves that GOD IS WITH US, and this assurance is the key to our Christian faith and to all those who have lost hope in their lives and find no more meaning to live their lives.

God's Word, today, consoles us "He is like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering lambs in his arms" the Lord is feeding us with hope, comfort, consolation, and heals every hurt and wounds caused because of our indifferences to God and to our brothers and sisters. He gathers us in His arms and fills us with joy and peace everlasting, the joy and the peace which the world can't give.

Today, we are invited to experience Christ the Lord in our lives in a realistic way as we profess our faith in him. How can the hope, the comfort, the consolation and the healing of the Lord be made our own? It is by making the gospel as the foundation of our life; and the source of our living and decision making. We are called to live the gospel courageously in our life-situations, culture, political and economic conditions. The gospel prepares us to respond to Christ's invitation to follow him in a radical way under all circumstances. The gospel makes us to experience Christ in our innermost being and to have profound relationship with him. It is demanding; but the Lord comes to our aid, GOD IS WITH US The coming of Christ Jesus is the cause for our joy, a deeper experience than Christmas cheer. A voice cries in the wilderness, 'Prepare way for the Lord, Make a straight the way' for our God across the desert. Into the despair of the wilderness the Lord brings hope.

Friends, have hope; the Lord will change our sorrows into joy. On our part we need to make that first step of 'filling valleys and levelling mountains of darkness of our life with the Light of Christ. To embrace the future with hope should be the foundation of Christian vocation. we are called to practice the virtue of hope, the fruit of our faith in the Lord of history, who continues to tell us: "Be not afraid... for I am with you" (Jer 1: 8). Pope Francis says, "This hope is not based on statistics or accomplishments, but on the One in whom we have put our trust (2 Tim 1:2), the One for whom "nothing is impossible" (Lk 1:37). This is the hope which does not disappoint; it is the hope which enables Christian life to keep writing its great history well into the future." Let the hope of Christmas fill our hearts an't homes.
