Next Sunday's Mass Readings Ecclesiasticus 3: 2-6; Psalm 127; Colossians 3: 12-21; Luke 2: 22-40 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

'I am the handmaid of the Lord'

Do you want to see amazing things happening in your life? Then enter a partnership with God as Mary did in the Gospel reading of today. As we approach this joyful feast of Christmas, open the closed doors of our hearts to God, let Him come in as Mary did. The readings of today speak to us about the amazing things that happened in the lives of God's people especially two key persons in the Bible, King David and Mary.

In the first reading of today, King David who lived about 1000 years before Christ, wanted to build a worthy dwelling place for God because God had already done so many surprising things in his life. But for this generosity of David, God surprised David with an unimaginable promise. God tells him, that instead of David building a house for God, GOD would build a house for David, a dynasty and a kingdom that would last forever. The Messiah, the Son of God would be his descendant and therefore his dynasty and his kingdom would last forever.

In the Second Reading of today, St. Paul glorifies God for the fulfilment of the mysteries that were kept secret in the past. But God unfolds in surprising ways all the mysteries through Jesus Christ in our days. Finally, in the Gospel, the angel Gabriel invites Mary to go into a joined venture with God, in God's rescue operation of saving humankind. Our God is NOT an imperious God who wants to do things by himself, but he wanted the cooperation of a simple, humble Jewish girl from Nazareth to unfold his amazing plans for humanity. God approaches her with great respect for her freedom and dignity. Mary could have said, "Sorry Gabriel, I have my own plans to settle my life with Joseph and lead a quiet life with many children". But she did not do that. She allowed God to have HIS way.

We are just by the threshold of Christmas. We are busy these days selecting the right gifts and the right Christmas cards to give to our dear ones. We are busy choosing the right decorations and the right dishes for Christmas. It is a season of choices. But we must remember that we have this Christmas because Mary made the right choice in favour of God and therefore the most unexpected and most surprising thing happened in human history - the Virgin bearing a child and giving birth to the Son of God and Messiah! We too can enjoy surprises from God when we too say YES to God in our daily life, "Behold, I am the servant of the Lord, have your ways and your plans in my life!".

My dear friends, all of us look for happiness in life and we think that happiness and fulfilment come in our lives by "doing OUR OWN thing". What I want, is all that matters, without any commitment to anyone or anything. We know by our experience that this selfish attitude always leads us to dislike and disappointments. The truth is that we experience happiness when we make a gift of our choices to others especially to God. We have this Christmas because Mary made the perfect gift of her choice to God. This is the best Christmas gift we can give to God and to others at this Christmas that is, 'Make God the preferential choice in life', let others be also very important in your life, yet God's choices be important and engage in a partnership with God. I assure you that amazing things will happen in your life too! And many surprises will happen in your fa⁴mily and in your relationships too!
