# We are the temples of the Holy Spirit

We are so used to seeing images of Jesus that are meek, mild and in pain. Very rarely do we get to see portraits of him smiling or laughing or even angry. Anger is an emotion like any other emotion. It is part of being human. While Jesus expressed his anger quite spontaneously, many of us have trouble dealing with our anger in an appropriate manner. Some people deny and swallow their anger. As a result they might convert their anger into ulcers or some other ailments. Others express their anger as hurt or as a feeling of being victimized that can even lead to depression. Finally, there are some who ventilate their anger in very disproportionate and destructive ways either through verbal abuse or physical violence that is quite unacceptable in modern, civilized society.

In today's Gospel reading we see Jesus getting angry in the temple. One thing we notice here is that Jesus regularly joined others in the worship. Many like to draw a distinction between temple worship and the Mass we celebrate every Sunday. In reality they are very similar. The main difference is that while the Jews had regular sacrifices in their temple, we do not offer any sacrifice of animals, we only offer the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass in which we only commemorate the Sacrifice of Christ, which is the ultimate Sacrifice. Jesus is the Lamb of God, sacrificed once and for all as an explation for the sins of humanity. We do not have the temple because, as the bible tells us, we the people of God are the temples, temples of the Holy Spirit. In the gospel we read that when Jesus came to the temple, He did not find worshippers in the temple, but He saw His Father's house turned into a marketplace where trade within the temple grounds and cheating the poor worshippers took place. He saw people making great profit, not raising great praise to God. He was sick of seeing all this. So, he made a whip and began casting them out of the temple. Here we must understand something. Jesus' anger was not a sinful anger like ours. We get angry when our ego gets hurt, but Jesus got angry when His Father was wronged.

Now, to go a little deeper into what Jesus was doing by driving out those who were doing business in the temple, He was destroying the idolatry that was taking place in the temple which were perverting the true worship of God. These practices had been going on for so long in the temple. When Jesus tried to remove the corrupt practices and wrong traditions, he became the bad guy for them. Please note that it was clearly taught by the prophets that when the Messiah comes, He would correct the misguided worship of Israel (Zech 14:21). Jesus says, "zeal for my Father's House will devour me". Therefore, He cannot tolerate anything that destroy the sanctity of the temple. We are the temples of the Holy Spirit that we too need to respect and safeguard it with respect and dignity. Today we can see human body becoming an easy target of abuse and mistreat that it is being treated by oneself and others as mere object. One of the deadly evils in today's world is the sin of the flesh which takes away every dignity of human body. Therefore, our Lord while expressing his anger was emphatic in alluding to the temple as his own body. We too need to be responsible for and respect our own bodies as temples and bring about closeness and love of God and our neighbour. God bless us.
