EASTER SERVICES

Due to the restrictions on numbers in church, booking will be required for the following Masses over the Easter period: Maundy Thursday (7.30 pm), Good Friday (3.00pm), Easter Vigil (Saturday, 8.00pm) and Easter Sunday (8.30 am and 10.30 am). Booking will open from Sunday 7th March and close on Palm Sunday. Places are still available at the Maundy Thursday, Easter Vigil and Easter Sunday Masses. On Good Friday, places are now only available in the Parish Hall.

Mass continues to be open to the public. In light of cases of the South African variant of Covid-19 being identified locally, we would like to remind all parishioners to ensure that you fully observe the rules that are in place at the Sacred Heart Church. Next Sunday's Mass Readings Acts 10: 34, 37-43; Psalm 117; 1 Corinthians 5: 6-8; Mark 16: 1-7 Passion Sunday or Palm Sunday is the beginning of Holy Week in which the church commemorates the Last Supper and the first Eucharist on Holy Thursday and Christ's Death on Good Friday and the glorious Resurrection on Easter Sunday. The Holy week is an experience of mixed feelings. It's a moment to rejoice as well as a moment of sadness. My dear brothers and sisters, we know through human experience that life is a mixture of joys and sorrows, ups and downs. Life is a blend of everything. The Passion and the Resurrection of Jesus must enlighten our minds to understand the meaning and the facts of life in total perspective.

The Liturgy of the Word invites us to reflect on the suffering of Christ our Saviour, which unfolds into our human salvation. The Cross which was once the sign of suffering and shame, has become a sign of Victory and Grace. The suffering and crucifixion of Jesus is specifically called Passion because no part of the life of Jesus evokes so much emotion, passion and compassion. The Sorrowful mysteries of the Holy Rosary provide a good summary of the Passion narrative. These five mysteries: the agony in the garden; the flogging (scourge); crowning with thorns; carrying of the cross and crucifixion were all moments of intense struggle and emotion. Mel Gibson's film, The Passion of the Christ, in 2004 attracted millions of viewers because of the graphic presentation of the Passion of Christ. The movie demonstrates the intensity of the suffering and anguish of Jesus. The Passion of Jesus is also an eloquent story of betrayal by a trusted friend and confidant. His Passion tells us that suffering is not reserved for sinners but that the innocent also suffers. John Piper, author of the book The Passion of Jesus Christ, says: "Christ did not die to make good works merely possible or to produce a half-hearted pursuit. He died to produce in us a passion for good deeds." Therefore, the ultimate lesson of the Passion story is positive: the tree of death (the cross) is transformed into the tree of life.

We can make the Holy Week more spiritual and meaningful through a Metanoia experience, change of heart and mind. We are called to respond positively and constructively for our own good and for the good of others. We are invited to make the difference by sharing Jesus' love, mercy, compassion and forgiveness with our brothers and sisters. The Holy Week which is the most important week in the Catholic Liturgical Calendar must assist us to reach the peak of our Christian living. The Holy Week which will culminate through the Resurrection of Jesus on Easter Sunday, must empower us to be the carriers of Gospel values which is the need of the hour in the present society we live in. Let us thank God for not being the carriers of Coronavirus which has brought the entire humanity stand still and on its knees. The Lock Down the world is facing today must deepen our Faith and Trust in the Lord as a family for He is our Shield and Protector. Let us strive to make the Holy Week more meaningful, though we are all wrestling with testing and uncertain moments caused by Coronavirus. Let us not forget that it was Jesus' suffering that gave us Victory and Salvation.

God remains silent when evil and sin shout, scream and destroy. When the life of the Son of God is snuffed out, it is then that God speaks. He speaks loud and clear. He speaks not in vengeance, counter-attack and destruction. God does not retaliate Pilate, the Roman soldiers, the high priests and the passers-by. Instead, he splits a curtain and makes himself open and available! Jesus "emptied himself" totally and became filled with the Spirit of his Father. He clung to nothing; he let go of everything. Do we have the courage to do likewise?

May God bless you to have a Jesus filled Holy Week. Fr. George Mathew SCJ
