FIRST HOLY COMMUNION PROGRAMME 2021

If your child is in Year 3 or above and you wish for your child to be prepared to receive this Sacrament in the summer 2021, please would you contact Fr. George SCJ as soon as possible. The first meeting for parents and children will take place in May, date and time will be announced in due course. Due to the Covid-19 restrictions in place, this year the children being prepared by the parish will receive their First Holy Communion separately from the children at St. Joseph's. REPORT ON THE ONLINE LENT RETREAT 2021

During Lent two groups of people met weekly online for an hour, 13 of us on Tuesday afternoons and 15 on Thursday evenings. We came from different churches, different denominations and different places – including several from Sacred Heart. The Jesuits at ISC in Glasgow sent daily emails with a Scripture reading, a short reflection, a picture and a piece of music all on the day's theme. We all prayed individually for 20 to 30 minutes each day with whatever parts of that day's material that seemed to speak to us. At the weekly online meetings, we shared what we wanted to of our felt experience during or after our prayer, though without further discussion. It was a listening group. Right from the start we were surprised how deep and open was this sharing and we all felt that that Spirit was moving strongly amongst us and there was a strong feeling of community in the groups. Again surprisingly, it seemed that doing this all on Zoom, rather than being physically present, made it easier for people to take part and to share so easily and deeply. We felt it a really blessed retreat.

Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Acts 1: 15-17, 20-26; Psalm 102; 1 John 4: 11-16;

John 17: 11-19

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

Love one another as I have loved you.

Once a man was sharing his 50 years of challenging, at the same time witnessing life experience with his wife. His wife could be the most irritating, intolerable and short-tempered person one can ever find. Sometime life with her can be a hell like experience. Then I asked him, how could he live 50 years with her. His reply was unbelievable. He said, "God has entrusted her in my care, so that I could love her as Jesus did, even though sometimes she doesn't deserve it. If I don't who else will love her and tolerate her?". What powerful words!! Love is the basis of all our relationships in life. Jesus our Lord teaches us the best way to love. Jesus gives us a commandment in today's gospel, and it is not an easy one. We are to love one another as he has loved us, this same invitation is repeated in the 2nd reading as well. St. Peter in the 1st reading is presenting a dynamic truth; he says, "that God does not have favourites."

Now loving others in general is a noble and beautiful ideal. But loving particular people can be a challenge. When someone irritates us at work or at school or in our family or our community, loving that person seems unreasonable. When someone ignores us or hurts us unjustly, loving that person can seem impossible. So, there could be a tendency to try to wriggle out of Jesus' commandment. We say to ourselves, "That person is a big pain, is very selfish or manipulative. That person does not deserve to be loved." But Jesus has anticipated our objection and shaped his commandment accordingly. He says, "Love one another as I have loved you." And how has Jesus loved us? He has loved us even though we at times are selfish and manipulative. He has loved us even though we do not deserve his love. So, Jesus gives us no room to escape from his commandment. We are to love others, even though they do not deserve to be loved.

So how do we make this seemingly impossible way of loving possible? Jesus shows us the way. In the gospel, before he gives us the command, he shows us how we can follow it. Before he tells us to give love, he tells us to RECEIVE love. The love that we are to take is the love of Jesus. He says, "Remain in my love. Then my joy will be yours, and your joy will be complete." Jesus is telling us that we must first RECEIVE his love to give love to others. Now what does it mean to remain in Jesus' love? Jesus has loved us by giving us life, by directing our abilities, and by giving us family and friends. Jesus has loved us by walking with us on those difficult days when we struggle to hope. Jesus has loved us by giving us the wisdom to make good decisions and the strength to carry them out. In all these ways and more Jesus has loved us. When we call to mind all those blessings, we remain in his love. Once we remain in his love, we can follow his commandments. Surrounded by the love that we have received from him, we are able to love others, even though they may not deserve it.

So do not despair when Jesus asks you to love someone who has hurt you or someone who annoys you. First surround yourself with his love. Draw strength from the love you have received from him, and then try to love someone who is difficult. If we try to love based on our own love, we will often not succeed. But if we draw strength from his love, we may find that it is possible to accept the people who irritate us and to forgive those who have hurt us. So come, let us be channels of God's merciful love always.
