#### **CASHLESS GIVING**

During the current Covid 19 pandemic, the trend towards cashless giving and online payments using credit and debit cards has become more popular. We have decided to make these payment options available to parishioners and visitors who may wish to donate. We expect them to be available within the church and on our website in the coming weeks. Donations by cash, standing order and using Gift Aid envelopes will also remain an option. In the church there will be a cashless giving terminal with a tap and go facility. This will be set up to give the option of donating for general parish funds (the first collection), specific fundraising collections, mass offerings and charitable/second collections when they occur. Gift Aid payments will also be possible. Once operational, the payment system will also enable fast payments to be made. An online link will also be available to make payments through our website. This system is already in use within many churches in our diocese and has proved to be very popular with parishioners and visitors. ### Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Job 38: 1, 8-11; Psalm 106; 2 Corinthians 5: 14-17; Mark 4: 35-41 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

### We Walk by Faith and not by Sight

There are three distinctive cultures we can find in this world in which we live today. Where in each culture we can see some sort of manipulations by people who conveniently do it for selfish reason. They are economic, religious and political cultures. Economic culture is manipulated by money. Religious culture is manipulated by some wrong theories about God and political culture is manipulated by power. It is in this context we are reflecting about today's liturgy.

St. Paul in our second reading tell us that we walk by faith and not by sight. Our entire Christian life is summarized by this very phrase because faith has the power to transcend beyond human intellect. Therefore, faith gives the primary orientation and direction to Christian life. Although, we cannot fully comprehend the will of the God, we show our faith by aligning our will with God's will, a kind of Faith Seeking understanding as St. Thomas Aquinas would put it. It is perhaps the most difficult part of being a Christian - to understand God's will contrary to the understanding of the world where people look for tangible evidence for everything that affects human life. Putting aside our own wills, our own desires, and our own self-interest, which seems against normal human nature, to do His work. That is the faith Paul is propagating. A faith that goes beyond physical world realities.

Jesus uses two parables to describe this point clearer. The kingdom he invites us to is a simple and peaceful one which grows gradually and steadily. It is open to all who seek it with a sincere heart. God maintains and sustains everything within it. The focus of this parable is not on the work of the farmer who planted the seeds, but on the work of the seed, which obtains its growth from a mysterious source and grows so slowly that one can hardly notice it. In this kingdom, God is present and doing His part in a manner that we can hardly explain or see. Yet, His invisible work is seen in the nature. The only thing we need to do is simply to plant a seed of faith in Jesus, and God himself will do the rest. Again, in the second parable, the mustard seed which is the smallest seed refers to our faith as Christians, in relation to the Kingdom of God. Therefore, Jesus tells us that: "If you have faith like a grain of mustard seed...nothing will be impossible for you (Mtt 17, 20)." Faith grows and when it does, it achieves great things. To be a man of faith we need not become a theologian or a scholar on spirituality but simply believe that Jesus My Lord and God that is all matters. When we grow in faith we not only grow as an individual but as a community. This is what Jesus means in the parable: "The birds of the air come to take shelter under its branches." Our faith in Jesus should give shelter to the people who are in need of some comfort in their sorrow and despair, in pain and in brokenness. The liturgy of the word tells us never give up on God. Always walk by faith and not by sight. May God bless you!
