## Pope Francis to launch the Synod, National Novena to John Paul II, Sr Anna talks about the Virgin Mary in the new Women in Scripture podcast



### The Synod 2021 - 2023

Pope Francis will formally open the Synod in Rome this weekend (9/10 October) with dioceses across the world following the weekend after (16/17 October).

A Mass to mark the Opening of the Synodal Pathway in the Archdiocese of Birmingham will take place at St Chad's Cathedral on Sunday 17 October, celebrated by Archbishop Bernard Longley. **All are welcome to join via the Cathedral live stream.**

His Grace will also be releasing a Pastoral Letter to mark the occasion and will use this opportunity to combine the work of the Synod with our work on the Diocesan Vision.

The overall theme is 'For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission'.

## National Novena to St John Paul II

Ahead of the Assisted Dying Bill which is due to receive its Second Reading, with full debate, on Friday 22 October there will be a national novena seeking the intercession of St John Paul II, on whose feast the Second Reading falls.

It will run from 13-22 October.

The Novena Prayer:

Merciful God, we pray with thanks and gratitude for the great spiritual gift of Saint John Paul II's apostolic life and mission. Through his heavenly intercession we ask that the 'Assisted Dying' Bill be defeated and that the infinite worth of each human person is upheld through proper investment in palliative care. Grant also that we may grow in love for You and proclaim boldly the love of Jesus Christ to all people. Through Christ, Our Lord. Amen.
