#### DEFIBRILLATOR

Dear Parishioners and Neighbours, we have recently installed an emergency cardiac defibrillator. This is mounted on the wall of our Parish Hall in an easily visible yellow box. This is a community public access machine intended for use by anyone in need. We do of course hope that you will never need it but if someone in your household or attending a church service is suffering a cardiac arrest you may find it useful. You will naturally be calling the ambulance on 999. If you do this on your landline the operator will give you the key code if you tell them the machine is at the Sacred Heart Church, Worcester Road, Droitwich. If you call on your mobile and ask for the code they will already know where you are and be able to give you the code to operate the defibrillator. The defibrillator will prompt you by voice in telling you what to do. The provision of this facility has been enabled by the magnificent support of a local charity dedicated to coronary care. #### **NOVEMBER : MONTH OF THE HOLY SOULS**

It is a good time to offer the sacrifice of Mass for a loved one in November and also someone you know who is in need or close to you. There are Mass Intention Request envelopes available in the Narthex if you wish to have Mass offered for deceased relatives and friends.

Next Sunday's Mass Readings Daniel 7: 13-14; Psalm 92; Apocalypse 1: 5-8; John 18: 33-37 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

### Do not be afraid, for I have conquered the world

We are almost at the end of the liturgical year. Next Sunday is Christ the King and then we enter season of Advent. Today the readings direct our attention to the end of time. We are promised that if we are faithful, we shall not be destroyed and the Archangel Michael will be there helping us. We are told that the one great sacrifice for sins has been made and we must cling to the Lord. God will gather His people and we must be ready.

The upsetting revelation, however, is not in time and space; it is a spiritual revolution within, a change of heart. The Lord is exhorting the Christian community to be vigilant and ready to recognize the signs of total salvation which is accomplished in and through the person of Christ; by offering a sacrifice once for all he has perfected for all times those who are sanctified, as the second reading tells us. Having been defeated and dethroned, evil opposes Christ and the Christian community with all its might. The Church experiences obstacles and persecution in proclaiming the Gospel. We see this happening. If we look at Scripture as a whole, this possibility of hell, of being rejected, is always there. On the other hand, it is never the great focus of the Scripture. The focus of Scripture is God's everlasting love for us; God's desire that all be saved; God's walking with us to lead us in the path of salvation. While we should always be aware of our capacity to reject God and to reject the ways of God, we should be more aware of God's love for us and should try to respond to that love. God invites us to know His love, His saving power, His delight in us.

The second reading is from the Letter to the Hebrews reminds us that any human high priest cannot make a complete amendment for our sins. Neither you nor I can atone completely for our sins. It takes Jesus, who is God and man, to make the one sacrifice for sins that never needs to be repeated. Sin is vanquished in Christ Jesus. On the other hand, sin in us is only overcome when we become one with Jesus Christ. God truly loves us and sends His Own Son to take away sin so that we can live forever with God.

The challenge is not to know when the end is coming but to live today and everyday preparing ourselves and be ready for that day whenever it comes. There is no sense in pretending with God. God knows our hearts and our minds, even more than we do. We must simply get on with living now as if this is our last moment - with no fear and no upset, completely trusting in the love of the Lord. God bless us.
