

From the Rector



The beginning of November - or, strictly speaking, the end of October - sees the end of British Summer Time. as the clocks go back one hour. As the leaves fall and the daylight lessens, we try to resist the temptation to think about preparing for the great commercial festival of 25th December (!) and, instead, are offered the solemnity of All Saints at the month's beginning, and the Commemoration of the Faithful Departed, All Souls.

On 1st November we rejoice with all those – perhaps known to few or, indeed, only to God - who surround God's throne in heavenly joy, plunged into the ocean of love. Having tried to live by faith, hope and love, they nevertheless weren't always perfect, but knew how to repent and start again. In the Communion of Saints, we can rightly ask for the prayers of these many friends in heaven.

The day after, we pray for our dead. In the same Communion of Saints, we offer our prayers for the Holy Souls in Purgatory: those who, in the words of Benedict XVI, are in the inward process of transformation in which a person becomes capable of Christ. (Let God's light shine forth, p172).

As St John Fisher, Bishop of Rochester and martyr, said this about the Holy Souls: They are of the same faith, hope and charity as us. They are partners in the same sacraments, but there are also the natural ties of affection, kinship and obligation. Every one of us has some of his or her friends and family there, therefore we must act like friends, let us be loving towards them now just as we claimed to love them when they were still with us on earth.

Remembrance Sunday claims our prayers for those who have died as a result of war, and none of us can

forget those who've died as a result of Covid, or relatives and friends who've passed away. So, we can't really escape from what are traditionally called Last But this shouldn't fill us with gloom, rather confidence in the risen Christ, not in our own merits. As a verse in an evening hymn, goes,

> Grant us an evening bright and fair, may life no sunset ever see; but at the last may we behold the glory of eternity. Amen.

We have just completed our Rosary Refuge in the Immaculate Heart of Mary. **October Rosary Mission**

It was a joy each night at 8pm to join a different parish/shrine for this and to pray together for the intentions of the conversion of peoples and for true Faith, Life and Peace to prevail in both family and national life.

We thank Bishop John Keenan; the Cardiff Oratorians; the Dominican Sisters of St. Joseph in Lymington; Fr. Gerard Hatton from Knaphill, Surrey; Fr. Derek Hyett from Dalston; Fr. Lawrence Lew at the London Rosary Shrine; and the priests of Our Lady's Shrine here in Walsingham.

We prayed for the flourishing of God's Holy Church and have encouraged the practice of the First Saturdays, as requested by Our Blessed Lord and the Blessed Mother through the apparitions in Fatima and, more importantly, through Sr. Lucia as an adult, beginning with the specific First Saturday request in Pontevedra, Spain on December 10th 1925. At the heart of the First Saturday Message is the Peace Plan of Heaven for our times. If we implement this as God requested we will see miracles of transformation both in the Church and in the World. Governments and people spend many hours trying to bring peace to the world. The question has to be asked! Where is it? Peoples and Governments think they know the way to peace; reality tells us otherwise! As we continue to ignore God and the requests of his Holy Mother, so our world and peoples degenerate ever further into degeneration, disaster and war. God has offered us a way to Peace and Conversion through Our Lady's Peace Plan - the Rosary and the First Saturday Devotion of Reparation to her Immaculate Heart. The Rosary Refuge in the Immaculate Mary served as an appeal to begin to implement this!



Praying the Rosary with Sacred Art - MYSTERIES MADE VISIBLE

Fr. Lawrence Lew has produced a book which is inspirational and unique among books on the Holy Rosary, for it both speaks at the level of the intellect and at the level of the heart. This is often a rarity amongst spiritual authors.

The visual images of Sacred Art have been carefully chosen and deeply depict the beautifully chosen meditative reflections, which indicate they are both the fruit of deep prayer. Fr. Lawrence is a realist and knows that people often struggle with the praying of the Rosary. He addresses this with wisdom and insight and gives helpful suggestions as to how they might be overcome. He knows the mind of 21st century men and women! He helps us to pray the Rosary with deeper love, devotion and understanding.

Truly, each Mystery of the Rosary has been made VISIBLE!

I was not expecting this book to touch me so deeply! Fr. Lawrence has a great gift of preaching and this shone through, and many of you, will know from his leading of the Friday evening Rosary at 8pm. I could almost hear him! Those in his parish are greatly blessed to have him as Parish Priest of the London Rosary Shrine.

Fr. Lawrence situates the Rosary from its origins in the mists of time and makes it accessible and relevant for these times. He demonstrates the urgency of its meaning through quotes from the Saints and from the Blessed Mother herself. The Rosary is the 'Spiritual Sword' for these times to combat evil and is a major element of 'Heaven's Peace Plan'.

It is a joy, at the end of the book, to have clear instructions as to how to pray the Rosary, alongside in English and Latin, the favourite, traditional Marian anthems and litanies. All in all a very complete book on the Holy Rosary! A book to go back to time and time again, for it opens up the eternal mysteries of Heaven to earth - Walking through the life of Jesus with Mary. Our Lady Queen of the Most Holy Rosary, pray for us.
