#### DEFIBRILLATOR

We have recently installed an emergency cardiac defibrillator. This is mounted on the wall of our Parish Hall in a yellow box. This is a community public access machine intended for use by anyone in need. If someone in is suffering a cardiac arrest you may find it useful. You will naturally be calling the ambulance on 999. If you do this on your landline the operator will give you the key code if you tell them the machine is at the Sacred Heart Church, Worcester Road, Droitwich. If you call on your mobile and ask for the code they will already know where you are and be able to give you the code to operate the defibrillator. The defibrillator will prompt you by voice in telling you what to do. The provision of this facility has been enabled by the magnificent support of a local charity dedicated to coronary care. **Next Sunday's Mass** Readings Jeremiah 33: 14-16; Psalm 24; 1 Thessalonians 3: 12 - 4: 2;

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

## Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom!

To mark the end of the liturgical year, today we celebrate the Solemnity of Christ the Universal King. The feast was instituted by Pope Pious the XI in 1925. Pope felt that the nations would see that church has the right to freedom and immunity from the state that the leaders and nations would see that they are bound to give respect to Christ and the faithful will find strength by celebrating the feast as we are reminded that Christ must reign in our hearts, mind, will and bodies. The Scripture readings take us through the theme of the centrality of Christ. On this feast I would like to highlight few thoughts taken from one of the homilies of Pope Francis.

Pope Francis emphatically states that, "the image of Jesus in the Gospel enables us to see that Jesus is the centre of creation; and so the attitude demanded of us as true believers is that of recognizing and accepting in our lives the centrality of Jesus Christ, in our thoughts, in our words and in our works. And so, our thoughts will be Christian thoughts, thoughts of Christ. Our works will be Christian works, works of Christ; and our words will be Christian words, words of Christ. But when this centre is lost, when it is replaced by something else, only harm can result for everything around us and for ourselves.

Besides being the centre of creation, Christ is the centre of the people of God. Today, he is here in our midst. He is here right now in his word, and he will be here on the altar, alive and present amid us, his people. We see this in the second book of Samuel 5: 1-3: In searching for an ideal king, the people were seeking God himself: a God who would be close to them, who would accompany them on their journey, who would be a brother to them. Christ, the descendant of King David, is really the "brother" around whom God's people come together.

Finally, Christ is the centre of the history of humanity and also the centre of the history of every individual. To him we can bring the joys and the hopes, the sorrows and troubles which are part of our lives. When Jesus is the centre, light shines even amid the darkest times of our lives; he gives us hope, as he does to the good thief while hanging on the Cross. While all the others treat Jesus with disdain, "If you are the Christ, the Messiah King, save yourself by coming down from the cross!" but the good thief begs him: "Remember me, when you come into your kingdom" (Lk 23:42). Jesus promises him: "Today you will be with me in paradise" (v. 43), in his kingdom. Whenever anyone finds the courage to ask for this forgiveness, the Lord does not let such a petition go unheard. Today we can all think of our own history, our own journey. Each of us has his or her own history: we think of our mistakes, our sins, our good times and our bleak times. On this day, we would think about our own personal history, to look at Jesus and to keep telling him, sincerely and quietly: "Remember me, Lord, now that you are in your kingdom! Jesus, remember me, because I want to be good, but I just don't have the strength, I need your help. Jesus' promise to the good thief gives us great hope: it tells us that God's grace is always greater than the prayer which sought it. The Lord always grants more, he is so generous, he always gives more Luke 21: 25-28, 34-36 than what he has been asked: you ask him to remember you, and he brings you into his kingdom!" God bless us.
