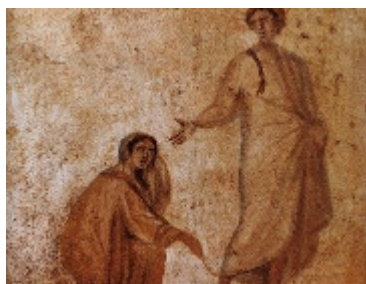

Refugee befriending training

Restore is motivating for action with their next training course for those interested in befriending or wanting to



learn more about refugee issues. The next training session will take place on:

Tuesday evenings
1, 8 and 15 February 2022
7:15pm – 8:45pm

The three sessions will take place on Zoom. Places must be booked in order to attend.

All three sessions of the training course are different, and anybody who is interested in becoming a befriender must attend all three. An outline of what is included in each session is:

Week 1: Global refugee issues, overview of situation in the UK, introduction to Restore and befriending including input from a volunteer befriender

Week 2: An overview of the asylum application process and introduction to refugee resettlement, including a refugee sharing about their experience of the asylum process

Week 3: Practicalities of befriending: guidelines, boundaries, safeguarding, support, contact with and feedback to Restore and how to apply.

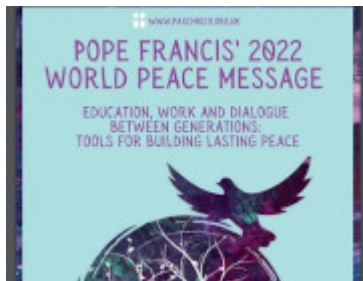

Housing Vacancy in Stratford
