Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Jeremiah 17: 5-8; Psalm 1; 1 Corinthians 15: 12, 16-20; Luke 6: 17, 20-26 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

### I am called to follow Him!

In today's Gospel we see a dramatic description of Jesus calling his first disciples. The call of the Lord comes in many ways: through dramatic inner visions as in the call of Isaiah or through the simple actions that we hear in the Gospel today, which are still miraculous, or through the preaching of others as we hear in the second reading from the First Letter to the Corinthians. The call of God to his people is persistent and permanent. The Prophet Isaiah describes how God touched his mouth. It is not clear whether this is an inner vision of Isaiah or a strong dream or some other way of perceiving the reality. On the other hand, it is clear that Isaiah takes it as God reaching into his personal life and cleansing him so that he can proclaim God's word to others. Because of this awareness of being cleansed and purified, Isaiah feels that he can be a mouthpiece to be sent by the Lord to His People.

We can note three salient features in all Divine calls: It comes from God, there is a purification and cleansing and finally there is a willingness on the part of the one who is called to respond with assent. Saint Paul in his First Letter to the Corinthians speaks about his personal call to serve the Lord. It also comes directly from God, it purifies and Paul becomes willing to follow the Lord. To this he added: "For I am the least of the apostles, not fit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God. But by the grace of God I am what I am, and his grace to me has not been ineffective. In today's Gospel, Jesus teaches from Simon's boat. Jesus turns to Simon and instructs him about where to lower the fishing nets. Simon and others have been fishing throughout the night and have not caught anything. Simon protests, claiming that such an effort would be futile. Simon ultimately obeys Jesus and lowers his nets into the deeper water as directed. It is because Peter obeys that he discovers the presence of God, is humbled, and then follows Jesus. Notice here that Peter calls Jesus by the title "master." He already recognizes Jesus as a person of authority. They catch so many fish that the nets begin to tear; Jesus' presence has created abundance out of scarcity, just as it did at the wedding feast at Cana, which we heard at Mass just a few weeks ago.

Simon Peter becomes a follower of Jesus immediately. Today's Gospel, therefore, marks a turning point in the relationship between Jesus and Peter. Two of Simon's partners are also named as witnesses to the event described in today's Gospel: Zebedee's sons, James and John. Yet Jesus' words are addressed only to Simon. Jesus gives Simon a new job, telling him that he will become a different kind of fisherman. No longer will he catch fish; instead he will catch people. In these words, we hear the beginning of the leadership role that Peter will have within the community of disciples. Peter was chosen for this role. His task will be to bring others to Jesus. Already he is doing so; the Gospel tells us that all the fishermen with Peter also left their nets and followed Jesus. We are called by our baptism to follow the Lord and bring people to him like Peter did. As Christians most of us are eager to do works of charity to the other, well and good; but some time we have a natural hesitation to talk about Jesus to other people. Some think doing good alone is enough. Yes, works of charity in itself is good but at the same time this can be done by an evil person as well. Therefore, by doing good alone does not necessarily qualify us to be a good Christian. To be a genuine follower of Christ, we need to know Him love him and introduce others to Him. As St. France Xavier would say, "As Christians, preach the Gospel of Christ always and use the words if necessary."
