Changes to Hall Hire

Parishes which operate halls are advised a number of Hall Hire-related documents have been updated.

The updated documents (1, 5, 6, 8 and 9) can be found on the diocesan website (link below).

A key update obliges the occupier to comply with all government or local authority guidance for the prevention of the spread of any infectious illness.

As there are now no legal restrictions in relation to Covid-19 and all government guidance has been withdrawn, we have now removed the guidance for reopening church halls, the hirer's pack and the risk assessments from the website.
