LIVESIMPLY INITIATIVE

Are you committing to live simply - think about what you can and can't change in your life right now. Maybe there are small steps you can take right away.

- Have you tried getting off the bus one stop earlier and walking, or aiming to cycle two days into work rather than one. Find out bus or train information. You want to travel to and from work using your own steam – like walking, running or cycling – practise your route at least once before you do it during a busy period of the day like rush hour. This is particularly important if you intend to cycle to work and you want to build up your confidence to cycle safely in traffic.
- Walk to Mass and meetings or share lifts. Offer someone who lives near you a lift to Mass.
- Use LED light bulbs and turn them off when they're not needed. Turn off computers and photocopiers when not in use.
- Check that you are recycling and composting as efficiently as possible.

Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Acts 13: 14, 43-52; Psalm 99; Apocalypse 7: 9, 14-17; John 10: 27-30 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

Are we reaching out to others?!

Today's reading from the Acts of the Apostles tells of the preaching of Jesus' followers and how they simply could not keep quiet about what had happened. Those who followed Lord Jesus then often found that they could not be silent about what He had done in their lives. This is happening even today. We hear testimonies of people about the ways that Jesus has changed their lives just like the early disciples. The second reading, from the Book of Revelation, takes us to heaven and gives witness that even in heaven, there is praise of the Risen Lord. It is as if heaven reflects to us what happened here on earth when Jesus rose from the dead.

The Gospel today brings us back to the post resurrection appearances of Jesus on lake Tiberius with a special and touching conversation between the Risen Jesus and Peter. Within one dialogue it combines two things. The mention of the "charcoal fire with fish on it" prepares us for this scene. Jesus used the 'charcoal fire' in his servant role as chef and as the giver of bread and fish. This 'charcoal fire' now serves as a witness for Peter's profession of love, recalling the previous 'charcoal fire' at the hour of Jesus' passion, next to which Peter had denied the Lord. There is the reconciliation between Jesus and Peter. Jesus offers Peter a public opportunity to profess 'repentance through love,' surely a striking example of what it is that re-establishes our relationship with the Lord after sin. In the gentlest of ways, the Risen Lord asks him, "Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these?" Peter now is confronted with his threefold denial and he ambiguously responds, "Yes, Lord, you know that I love you." Three times he is asked the same question just as three times he had denied. Now Peter is 'upset'. It deeply hurts him and he finally replies: "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Peter's threefold denial is balanced by his threefold profession of love. With this, he and the Lord are reconciled. The dialogue is more than a moment of reconciliation. Jesus now hands over to Peter and to his companions the mission he himself had been given by the Father. "Feed my sheep". This is the responsibility of the Church and, as members of that Church, a responsibility that rests in varying degrees on every one of us. It is not just bishops, priests, religious who have this responsibility. It is also that of parents, teachers and even simply of brothers and sisters to each other. But first we need to reconcile with Jesus, for in our day to day lives there may be so many occasions when we denied the Lord by being a false witness. We need to express from the core of our hearts the words of Peter: "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you". This is a call to friendship with Jesus as well.

As soon as Peter affirms his friendship with Jesus, He invites him to lay down his life for Jesus. Peter is aware that following Jesus is not going to be an easy task. He is ready, willing, and able. This witness is evident in the first reading in the Acts of the Apostles, Peter is willing to face any challenge that might come because of preaching the Risen Lord. He not only willing to suffer but also learned to rejoice in his suffering. The call to follow Jesus today will continue to be heard if there are people who dare open their hearts to his call. It will always a call to be a witness. Because the voice of Jesus can only be heard today in his disciples. He can be seen and experienced only those who are brave enough to follow Jesus and His teaching and reach out to others in Love.
