Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

He is our Shepherd!!

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ. Usually, the Fourth Sunday of Easter is celebrated as Good Shepherd Sunday. It offers us an opportunity to contemplate the quality of our relationship with our Lord. If Jesus is our shepherd, what is the quality of our Christian life that we live as members of His flock? Are we the kind of sheep that we ought to be? The image of the Good Shepherd and our self-examination on the quality of the sheep that we are is very much relevant as we move along the Easter season.

Jesus, in today's gospel, calls himself the Shepherd. We, the followers or believers, are the sheep. Sheep are receptive to the voice of the Shepherd. They recognise his voice and respond to it and do what he says because his voice is clear, sure and decisive. It is consoling to know that Jesus knows us. The challenge for you and me today is to hear His voice. Hearing the voice of the master is the sign of loyalty. All those who have domestic pets like dogs and cats must have noticed that they can be silent to the voice of a stranger but as soon as they sense the presence of the owner they jump up; it is their expression of their loyalty. Where does my loyalty lies? Whose voice am I paying attention to? If we maintain a personal and close relationship with Jesus our shepherd, we will be able to distinguish His voice from the many disturbing voices that are urging us to follow them with their voices. Hearing the voice of the shepherd is a sign of intimacy, of loving and being loved. The voice of the Shepherd is caring and loving, it's of warning and safety. It creates an intimacy between sheep and the shepherd with the same wavelength. When we recognise the voice of Jesus who leads us from the front, we will experience the intimacy of His love that assures us true security, because the challenges of the day are greater than our strength. When we know Jesus our shepherd, then this knowledge leads us to trust him very much. The Shepherd knows his sheep individually; He calls them by name, and they follow him. The fact is that the Good Shepherd pays much care and attention to his sheep. He goes before them. Today there are circumstances of life beyond our control, and we the sheep must depend on the Shepherd. The fact is that our Good Shepherd Jesus is dependable. He wants that you and I are safe under his care.

Have you ever heard the voice of someone who would lift the burden from your shoulder and place a lighter one instead? Some one who knows you by name and loves you? God is the one who is ever willing to lift us up. The fascinating thing about Him is that He knows us and He loves us we are. He does not look down upon us at our weakness but rather he accepts us with all our strengths and weakness. We know It is not the healthy and the able one but the weak and the stray one that get much attention from the shepherd. Therefore, we need not be timid because we are weak, but rather we can be assured that our Lord is impartial and he cares us all equally. The fact is that each of us who are here one or the other way are touched by our loving God and Lord who is our Good Shepherd. Let us renew our loyalty to him during this Eucharistic celebration the greatest sign of His love for us. God bless us.
