

The Rector reflects on the recent Organ Recital on the newly restored Schumacher's Organ


On Saturday 30th April, we were blessed with lovely weather at the Shrine. This was fortunate, because that afternoon, Daniel Justin, the Diocesan Director of Liturgical Music and Organ advisor was to give an inaugural recital on our newly-restored Schumacher pipe organ. Refreshments followed, and, thanks to the sun, were taken outdoors. People's enjoyment was by no means marred by views of the scaffolding on the north side of the Chapel, there to aid the roofers!

Daniel played a judicious selection of old music (Nicolaus Bruhns and Dietrich Buxtehude) and modern (his own, newly written Variations on the hymn tune 'Lady of Walsingham) and pieces in between. His selection displayed the versatility and strengths of this fine instrument, and his own virtuosity!

Fr Clive Birch SM, the Shrine Director when the Chapel of Our Lady of Reconciliation was built, had commissioned Schumachers, a Belgian firm, to build the organ, which was inaugurated in 1982. The years took their toll on the two manual pipe organ, and so the time was ripe to get necessary repairs and improvements done. It was fitting to have the instrument restored in time for its Ruby Jubilee.

The newly-restored organ now happily sounds in the Chapel accompanying Paschal music, glorifying God and edifying the worshippers and listeners. We're indebted to donors large and small for the necessary funding. Happy Easter!

Chapel of Our Lady of Reconciliation Roof Restoration Appeal

After 40 years of service, the weather-beaten tiles on the north-facing side of the Chapel roof have deteriorated and, with a helping hand from Storm Eunice, are disintegrating and sliding to the ground. Approximately 8500 tiles, along with the felt and wooden batons, are being replaced throughout April and May,

and an ingenious copper strip system put in place to keep the moss at bay. The roofers, AT Cornfield, are doing a sterling and sympathetic job!

Meet our staff: Janice Wells - Office Assistant


I have worked at the Bureau for about eighteen years now and have enjoyed every minute. My job is to make sure your time with us is safe enjoyable and spiritually rewarding.

I've been trained in first aid so if you are poorly, I can call you a doctor, or just reassure you, if that's all you need.


Sometimes a friendly face is all you need to make you feel better.



Dates for your Diary in celebration and commemoration

3rd – 10th June: Flower Festival in Our Lady's Church and Shrine

Friday 10th June: 125th Anniversary of the Opening of the Church in 1897. 12:00 Solemn Mass and Consecration of the Altar by the Bishop.

Sunday 12th June: 11.30am Sung Mass. The choir of St. Austin's, Wakefield, on tour in Norfolk will sing plainchant and polyphony.

Sunday 10th July: Garden Party with King's Lynn Town Band

Sunday 14th August: Solemnity of the Assumption of Our Lady. 3pm: the Red Mount Procession. Our Lady's Statue from the Shrine is taken in procession to the Red Mount Chapel and then returned to the church for Benediction of the

Blessed Sacrament and Tea.

Friday 19th August: 125th Anniversary of the Restoration of the Shrine in 1897. 7pm Solemn Mass of Thanksgiving. The preacher will be Monsignor John Armitage. Master of the Guild of Our Lady of Ransom.

Saturday 20th August: 125th Anniversary of the first pilgrimage to Walsingham in modern times. On 20th August 1897 a group of pilgrims (including Charlotte Boyd) went by train from King's Lynn to Walsingham and walked the Holy Mile to the Slipper Chapel for devotions. The 12 noon Mass at the Chapel of Reconciliation will commemorate this first pilgrimage which will be preceded by a procession from the old railway station (now St. Seraphim's).

Wednesday 2nd *November:* 12 noon Requiem for all the dead of the parish. This Mass will include the dedication of a plaque recording the names of all those buried in St. Mary's Burial Ground around the church.

Wednesday 14th December: Anniversary of the death of Fr. George Wrigglesworth 1900. After the 12 noon Mass a visit will be made to the grave of Fr. Wrigglesworth in Hardwick Road Cemetery.

Would you like to learn more about England's treasured title as the Dowry of Mary?

Edmund Matyjasek is offering the opportunity of Talks and Presentations to Parishes on England as the dowry of Mary, in and around the Home Counties and beyond.

The rededication of England as the Dowry of Mary took place in 2020 in the most unusual circumstances. For two years, a national pilgrimage of the Shrine statue of Our Lady from Walsingham toured English Cathedrals. The tour was to culminate at Westminster Cathedral in March 2020, to coincide with the

Miraculously, the rededication was able to go ahead online, on the appointed day of March 29th. Over half a million people logged on to participate, showing the extent of engagement throughout the country.

There is now the opportunity to complete the final act of this pilgrimage with the Shrine Statue visiting Westminster Cathedral on October 28th-29th 2022.

To help prepare for this unique opportunity to renew the Dedication of our country to Our Lady as her Dowry, Edmund Matyjaszek author of both *England: The Dowry of Mary, Meaning & Mission & The Rosary: England's Prayer* (St Paul's Publishing) is available to give talks and presentations to parishes, groups and schools on the Dowry, its history, importance and meaning for our time.

Edmund gave talks in 2019 to the Guild of Our Lady of Ransom and the Catholic Women's League on the Dowry that were collected and published in 2020.



This ancient title was first publicly proclaimed by King Richard II in 1381. In the months preceding the 2020 re-dedication, the statue of Our Lady of Walsingham toured all English Cathedrals, accompanied by an exhibition, talks and services. During this time, I was invited to give a talk to the Guild of Our Lady of Ransom, and later, in place of Mgr John Armitage, then Rector of the Shrine, to the Catholic Women's League at their AGM. This booklet is a record of these talks and is both a historical survey of the Dowry and a personal journey of how I came to understand its meaning and mission.


