RETURNING TO MASS AT PENTECOST: AN INVITATION FROM THE BISHOPS OF ENGLAND AND WALES

"Since the beginning of the Covid pandemic until the present time, we have shared with you our judgment that the situation of the last two years has meant that the Sunday Obligation has been impeded and has needed to be fulfilled in other ways. We thank God that this situation has now changed. The pressing challenges of the pandemic have lessened significantly. We therefore believe that the reasons which have prevented Catholics from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation no longer apply. We understand there will still be some members of our congregations who, for reasons of health, do not feel safe enough to return to Mass. It has always been the understanding of the Church that when the freedom of any Catholic to attend Mass in person is impeded for a serious reason, because of situations such as ill health, care for the sick or legitimate fear, this is not a breach of the Sunday Obligation. Our Catholic people and parishes have benefitted during these difficult times from the online streaming of Mass and other services. "Virtual viewing" of Mass online does not fulfil the Sunday Obligation. It may, however, be a source of continual spiritual comfort to those who cannot attend Mass in person, for example those who are elderly and sick, for whom the obligation does not apply. In this context, we recognise gratefully the ministry of those who administer Holy Communion to the elderly, sick and housebound. Looking forward to the forthcoming feast of Pentecost, we now invite all Catholics who have not yet done so to return to attending Mass in person." Next Sunday's Mass Readings

1 Kings 19: 16, 19-21; Psalm 15; Luke 9: 51-62

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

This is my body and blood!

Today we celebrate the most important aspect of our faith or the centre and summit of our Christian life - Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Jesus - Corpus Christi. We celebrate this feast in honour of the real presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. Jesus Christ is fully God and fully human and Jesus is giving the substantial, real and true presence in the Eucharist. How it happens? The bread and wine that is been offered during Holy Mass, through the concertation of an ordained priest, becomes the body and blood of Jesus Christ by transubstantiation that means the conversion of the substance of the Eucharistic elements into the body and blood of Christ at consecration, while the appearances of bread and wine remain the same.

The first Eucharist was celebrated in the upper room. Jesus took bread and said, "This is my body" "This is my blood". It became the real body and real blood of Jesus by the word of Jesus and action of the Holy spirit. Jesus did not say, 'this is like my body or like my blood'. So when a priest takes the bread and wine and tells, 'this is my body' 'this is my blood' he tells it in persona Christi - the person of Christ, not the priest but Christ is doing it through the priest, who is ordained by the apostolic church that carries the succession of the Apostles. Therefore, whenever we celebrate the Holy Eucharist, by the action of the Holy Spirit the same Eucharist at the last supper is repeated. CCC 1374: "In the most blessed sacrament of the Eucharist the body and blood, together with the soul and divinity, of our Lord Jesus Christ and, therefore, the whole Christ is truly, really, and substantially Contained". CCC 1374: "Because Christ our Redeemer said that it was truly his body that he was offering under the species of bread..., by the consecration of the bread and wine there takes place a change of the whole substance of the bread into the substance of the body of Christ our Lord and of the whole substance of the wine into the substance of his blood. This change the holy Catholic Church has fittingly and properly called transubstantiation". How long?. CCC 1377: "The Eucharistic presence of Christ begins at the moment of the consecration and endures as long as the Eucharistic species subsist. Christ is present whole and entire in each of the species and whole and entire in each of their parts..." The Catholic Church is the only church that believes and professes this truth in it entirety. How many of us truly and entirely believe this?

Once a non-Christian teacher was having a conversation with her Catholic student and the subject was Eucharist and at the end of the discussion the teacher said, "If at all I had faith in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist, I would have attended Holy Mass every day". If I miss a Sunday Mass, do I really miss it? There is always a danger of considering Eucharist as merely prayer service. It is more than a prayer service. Eucharist is and should be the centre and summit of Christian life. Each Christian should draw strength from the Eucharist. It unites us to the mystical body of Christ that is the church. "Those who receive Galations 5: 1, 13-18; the Eucharist are united more closely to Christ. Through it Christ unites them to all the faithful in one body - the Church. Communion renews, strengthens, and deepens this incorporation into the Church, already achieved by Baptism. In Baptism we have been called to form but one body." CCC 1396. God bless you.
