#### **RECENTLY DECEASED**



### Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Deuteronomy 30: 10-14; Psalm 68;

Colossians 1: 15-20; Luke 10: 25-37 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. ### Peace be with you!

Dear friends in Christ Jesus. Last Sunday we saw that the Samaritans shunned Jesus and his message. There were many villages that had not yet heard the message of Christ. Therefore, he visited another village and there he chose 72 of them and sent them with the same mission as the Apostles and sent them ahead of him to all the villages that he would visit. The mission of the 72 was to prepare the hearts of the people who would be visited by Jesus later. The master is very clear about his mission, so he gave a clear instruction to his messages. He said, "The harvest is rich, but the labourers are few, so ask the Lord of the Harvest to send labourers".

Jesus uses the analogy of a large field of grain, gold in colour ready for the harvest, but short of labourers. The grain field represents the vast humanity waiting to be gathered as God's people, but the gatherers are few. So, Jesus instructed them to pray to the Lord of the harvest to send labourers. That means the disciples need to continually rely upon God not of their own strength. He also warned them that they are to be sent like lambs among wolves. Sheep and lambs in the Bible represent people who accepted God and walk in His ways. At the same time wolves are symbolic representation of people who are a vicious person or enemy of God. It was a reminder that the world in Jesus' time and now are hostile to Jesus and his message. He also instructed them not to carry money or any other assurances. At fist glance we feel Jesus' instructions were unrealistic. Imagine a journey with no money or spare clothes and not to talk to anyone on the way. The purpose of this instruction was that the disciples should be focused on their mission and not to be distracted by matters that are less important because the job they must do is urgent and the time is short. The disciples are sent as messengers of peace. These greetings of peace represent the reconsolidation between God and Man. This peace basically means openness towards God and justice in dealing with all. Jesus assures the disciples of the possibility of his message being listened to, also the possibility of resistance and rejection. But they have to march under the banner of Jesus. Those who reject them are rejecting Jesus himself and shutting themselves out of the Kingdom of eternal bliss.

The modern world continues to be hostile to the message of Christ. Indeed, it seems that the very idea of God is being pushed out of our social fabric. Tragically, many have abandoned their Baptismal promises and have become slaves to the world and its pleasures. Praising God and the promise of the glory of heaven is no longer a priority for them. Look around you at the neighbouring pews. I'm sure you see a vacant seat where someone you know used to sit but haven't been seen in Church for a long time. It might even be a friend or relative. Next time you see one of these people, invite them back to Church; tell them how much they're missed; remind them that we need them and they need the Church. Let us never forget that through our baptism we, too, are laborers for the harvest! Dear friends, please pray for each other. Pray for those Catholics who no longer practice their faith. Pray for the Church, for our priests and bishops. Pray for those who, even today, are being persecuted for their faith. Pray that God will give us the laborers that we need for His abundant harvest. Amen.
