### Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Genesis 18: 20-32; Psalm 137; Colossians 2: 12-14; Luke 11: 1-13 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

### Do I have some time to sit by the Lord?

The 21st Century is known as the age of scientific discoveries, the age in which human beings can leap beyond the natural environment, even to the extent of going beyond space and time. As a result, lots of pressure is put on us and excessive multitasking has become common everywhere. Doing several tasks simultaneously may seem like the height of efficiency - and it would be if a person had more than one brain. Which in the real world can become a serious threat to health. So sometimes I need to tell myself - Slow Down! But I am not just able to do it. Today's Gospel challenges me to slow down, sit down and listen! "Martha, you are anxious and worried about many things." Said Jesus, who is not to be understood as encouraging laziness, nor blaming Martha for her hard work. After all, she was doing what she was doing for the Lord. But the Lord's reaction has a deeper meaning. Her problem was that she was "burdened with much serving"; she was distracted, being anxious and worried about many things. So, a question that I am invited to ask myself today is not how busy I am, but am I able to do what I am doing gracefully, without being anxious and worried.

So, Jesus reminds us that unless our hard work flows from a spirit of contemplation, it becomes burdensome causing much fretting and worrying. What is contemplation? "Mary sat beside the Lord at his feet" The posture of Mary in the gospel text of today is very crucial. It is a posture of a disciple. She has broken a taboo, a woman sitting at the feet of the Rabbi is shocking. Even Martha can't bear the sight. That could be another reason for her complaint. She reminds that the place of a woman is in the kitchen. Yet, Jesus thinks otherwise. He not only allows Mary to be his disciple, but invites Martha also to join her. Jesus invites everyone to sit beside the Lord. This is the first step in contemplation: slow down, and sit down at his feet!. "Mary sat beside the Lord ...listening to him speak. The second aspect to pay attention to in the gospel story of today is the disposition of Mary to listen to him speaking.

There are two separate movements - one sitting at his feet and the other contemplation. Our surrounding, busy nature of our life tends to influence our prayer and relationship with God in Jesus. We tend to rush with our prayers, sometimes we prefer the shortest Mass, always in a hurry to catch up with something else. The gospel story of today invites us to just sit there in prayer, listening to Him speaking. This is contemplation. We need to resist the temptation to be doing something. We just have to sit and listen. It is a patient waiting on God to deepen one's confidence in God's power and love. This attitude in prayer that builds increased confidence in God, also frees the person to love others more unconditionally and compassionately. This is what Jesus is inviting Martha to. We are not too late to begin to spend some fixed moments during the day in silent contemplation. The Martha in me is still in the process of becoming Mary. And there is a conviction growing in me though very slowly that which St Teresa of Avila, summed up: "Let nothing disturb you, nothing frightens you. All things pass. God alone does not change. Patience achieves everything." God bless you.
