Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

Today's Gospel is one of the most sublime passages in all of scripture dealing with the subject of Prayer. The following three facts prompted the apostles to ask Jesus to teach them to Pray. 1. Jesus often prayed, and he emphasized Prayer as one of the greatest needs of human life. 2. Jesus prayed as a son to his Father. The disciples also wanted to have such an intimate relationship with God. 3. John the Baptist had taught his disciples to pray. It was a common practice for a teacher to instruct his disciples in prayer. On this basis, they asked Jesus, "Lord, teach us to pray". Jesus gave them a model prayer upon which we are to put our base for prayer. It is a guide for prayer. The points of our prayer are these: 1. Thank God for being our Father. 2. Thank God for heaven which is a spiritual dimension of being, it is incorruptible and undefiled and it does not fade away. Most importantly, where God is we too can be. 3. Praise God for what He is because he is kind and compassionate, loving and merciful.

God is a father to us but in heaven what is being signalled is the right understanding of God. God is a power that reality neither grasps nor is hidden from. If I can grasp God, I start manipulating God, that is why he says he is in Heaven. What is in heaven I cannot control but I can relate to. The next word is 'Hallowed be thy name'- that means, God is the highest value of all. The idea of God being highest we hallow the name of God above all, peace will break out of us. When in my heart I hallow the name of God I become rightly ordered. So the basic thing that we can ask Lord brings me in line with you as the highest good. Then I say, "Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is heaven" Kingdom is the very prominent word in the New Testament. The kingdom of this world is the way in which we order things in our human way of thinking and acting. It is the world in a negative sense. What Jesus is asking us to pray is that the Kingdom that is in heaven, the right order that is in heaven which is based on love, peace and righteousness etc., may that order be obtained here on earth as there in heaven. During Mass we pray, "May our voices be one with theirs". We are asking that our voices may be one with the angels in heaven and be united ourselves and harmonise ourselves with God. Your kingdom come here as there! Your will be done: The world is the place where my own will is given priority. So in this prayer I am praying that may God's will supersede my will so that I am in harmony with God. Give us this day our daily bread: here we are not asking for the normal bread but super substantial bread, the bread for the journey - the Eucharist. Gives us each day your presence in the Eucharist. It is a prayer for communion with Christ. Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us: The heart of Jesus teaching is 'Forgiveness'. How many of our problems; personal, societal and cultural are caused by incapacity to forgive? The root cause of all the problems in the world is lack of forgiveness. If humanity learn to forgive each other, the world leaders learn to forgive, there would not be any war. We are basically frightened of others that is why we build walls and borders because we do not trust our neighbours. Nations spend billions to build walls and ammunitions thinking that they will bring us security. But history has proved that they never brought security and peace. We are asking the Lord, please give us the ability to forgive so that we can build bridges that unite nations and people, instead of walls. At the end we are praying Lord deliver us from Evil. So much evil we can see around. spiritual, interpersonal, psychological, social, geopolitical. When we are delivered from all this evil, we will be able to harmonise ourselves with God.
