#### **BARNARDO'S REPORT**

An independent review undertaken by the charity Barnardo's on behalf of the Archdiocese of Birmingham in relation to the management of concerns about Joseph Quigley, a priest in the Archdiocese, is now available on the Diocesan website: at https://www.birminghamdiocese.org.uk/news/review-into-archdiocese-safeguarding-published. The Trustees of the Archdiocese of Birmingham have accepted this review and its 18 recommendations in full and you can also see the full response on the website. As an institution it is for the present Bishops and Trustees to take corporate responsibility, to apologise, learn and ensure best safeguarding practice now and in the future. There has been a significant amount of positive change in Diocesan safeguarding practice. However, these recommendations will help inform ongoing learning and improvement within the Archdiocese.

### Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Ecclesiasticus 3:

17-20, 28-29; Psalm 67; Hebrews 12: 18-19, 22-24; Luke 14: 1, 7-14

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

### Who will inherit eternal life?

Today, the Gospel raises the theme of the salvation for our souls. This is the essence of Christ's message. The salvation of our soul is an actual fact insofar a gift from God, but for those of us that have not yet crossed the threshold of death, is only a possibility. To be saved or to be damned to hell! That is, to accept or to reject God's everlasting offer of love. St. Augustine said, "the man who self-annihilated his goodness, which could have been eternal, deserved the eternal damnation", which is against God's original plan. The purpose of God's creation of human being - 'is to be with Him, to love Him and to love all He created'. We have only two possibilities in our life: either God or the void, for without God nothing has any meaning. In this sense, when they do not participate of the essence of God, life, death, joy, pain, love, etc., are just concepts without any logic. When the man sins, he avoids the Creator's glance to centre it upon himself. God is constantly looking at the sinner with love, and in order not to force his freedom, He expects a minimum gesture of been willing to get back to him.

Christ does not respond to his disciples' question, 'Lord, is it true that few people will be saved? (Lk 13:23). Therefore, it remained unanswered, just as it is today, for "it is an inscrutable mystery between the holiness of God and the conscience of man. A few years ago Pope Francis, during a question-and-answer session with youngsters in one of Rome's parishes: A young boy, Emmanuel, wanted to know if his recently deceased dad, an unbeliever, was in Heaven. When the time came for him to pose his question to the Pope, the boy burst into tears and couldn't speak. Pope Francis called him to come close to him and whisper his question in his ear. Then, Pope Francis, with the boy's consent, shared his question with the audience. This is what the boy said: 'A little while ago my father passed away. He was a non-believer who had all four of his children baptized. He was a good man. Is dad in heaven?" 'God is the one who says who goes to heaven,' the Pope explained. He then asked the children to think about what God is like and, especially, what kind of heart God has: 'What do you think? God has a dad's heart. And with a dad who was not a believer, but who baptized his children and was a good man, do you think God would be able to leave him far from himself? Does God abandon his children when they are good?' The children shouted, 'No.' 'There, Emmanuel, that is the answer,' the Pope told the boy. 'God was surely proud of your dad, and you should be too, because he was a good man who wanted what was best for his children.'

As Pope Francis reminds us, we should leave to God the question of who will go to Heaven. It's not a question for us to answer. What should concern us is what God wants from us? What gateway is he setting before us? Perhaps, like the poet Robert Frost, we are being invited to opt for the road 'less travelled by' and that may make 'all the difference'. God is a loving dad, who always looks at our heart no matter how we appear externally. He sees our outmost desire to do good and avoid evil, even though many times we miserably fail. Salvation, cannot be bought, inherited or stolen, but simply gained by a life of doing God's<sub>4</sub>will and living under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit, the Third Person of the Blessed Trinity.
