HM QUEEN ELIZABETH II: 21 APRIL 1926 – 8TH SEPTEMBER 2022

Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Amos 6: 1, 4-7; Psalm 145; 1 Timothy 6: 11-16; Luke 16: 19-31 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

The Parable of the shrewd steward sounds so contemporary. "The children of this world are shrewder in dealing with their own generation than are the children of light", Jesus very openly reiterates to his disciples that they cannot serve God and wealth. Everything here on earth belongs to God and He is the owner and we are the tenants entrusted with the great responsibility of safeguarding God's creation with utmost care and watchfulness. We don't have anything that really is ours. St. Paul reminds us in 1 Timothy 6, "We brought nothing into the world, so we can't take anything out of it either". Through parable of the faithful steward Jesus teaches us four important lessons.

- 1: Do our best with what we have. It does not matter in God's eyes how much we have but it matters how well we use it. The widow is lauded by Jesus for her generous offering. Let us learn from sacred scripture: "Whatever we do in word or deed, do it all to the glory of God" (1 Cor 10: 31).
- 2: What we manage is not ours. All of us are stewards. Scripture tells us, "The earth is the Lord's and everything in it" (Ps 24: 1). We as stewards, belong to the Master. "In Him we live and move and have our being" (Acts 17: 28). Life, breath, and all things come from Him. Let us always bear in mind: what we manage is not ours.
- 3: The things we manage are not real. The wealth of this world is perishable and temporary. Our greatest blunder is to act as though this were not so! Let us understand as we read in the Bible that the one who lusts after the treasures of Earth, "when he dies, he shall carry nothing away." History tells us: Charlemagne was, at his request, buried sitting on his throne, wearing his crown, robe, and jewels. In his lap was an open Bible, and his dead finger was resting on Mark 8:36: "What good is it for a man to gain the whole world, yet forfeit his soul."
- 4: Not the dishonesty or the self-interest, but the cleverness the creative use of resources is what we need to emulate. Take creative advantage of every opportunity for the glory of God and to serve Him. Money cannot accompany us to Heaven. Let us keep in mind that possessions are a responsibility and their use constitutes a test of character, values and stewardship.

True wealth is faithfulness in serving him. The parable of today is not about money. It is about roots, the roots of our hearts. Where do they reach? What nourishes them best? Are our roots linked to earthly treasure? Or are roots connecting us to God our Creator? St. Paul tells us that the love of money is the root of all evil (1 Tim 6: 10). The amount we possess is not the issue. Our character is the issue. Our commitment is the issue. Our Faithfulness is the issue. Our love for Heaven is the issue. Hence, let us ask ourselves: will the possessions, friends and resources that we have gained here on earth lead us to God and his kingdom? May God help us to remain focussed on Him!
