Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Ecclesiasticus 35: 12-14, 16-19; Psalm 32; 2 Timothy 4: 6-8, 16-18

Luke 18: 9-14

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

Will Jesus find that we have persevered?

We live in a world of "instant solutions!" There is instant communication, instant coffee, instant tea, instant food, and an instant weight loss programme. Thus, in every area of our lives, we expect instant results. This leads to inability on the part of many to be patient and, to an even greater degree, a lack of perseverance. Perseverance is the theme in all the readings of today. Precisely perseverance in prayer. In the first reading when Moses continues to keep his hands raised in prayer, victory is assured. When Moses begins to grow weary and drop his hands, in a gesture which symbolises that he is on the verge of giving up, Joshua has to struggle. It is difficult for Moses to persevere in prayer and so, it is difficult for Joshua to persevere in battle. However, because Moses will not give up and perseveres, Joshua is finally victorious.

This is also the case with the widow in the Gospel text of today. She pleads and perseveres. She does not give up. Even though she had so many things going against her, she does not give in. She is a woman living in a patriarchal society where women had very little chance of getting respect and justice. Yet her perseverance wins the widow justice. The exhortation that Paul gives to Timothy, about being persistent, at the end of the second reading of today is an example of the early Christians who were patient and able to wait for what God had in store for them. Timothy is asked to remain firm and persevere whether the external situation is good or not so good and whether things are going his way or not. He is to be patient and not give up. He is not to give in.

One of the grave dangers that many of us face today is that of quick fix solutions. Many of us are hardly able to endure obstacles and difficulties without getting weary and tense. We are hardly able to be serene and calm in the face of challenges that come our way. One reason for this may be that we do not believe enough in ourselves. Another reason is that we do not believe enough in God. We have faith but not deep enough to believe the act that God will always do what is best for us, even when it decent appear to be. Some interpreters of the Gospel parable of today see, God who, like the widow, will not give up on human beings. Until they relent, he will persevere with them. Even if one accepts this interpretation, the point being made is the same. God does not give up on us. Why must we give up on ourselves? Why must we give up on others? Why must we give up on God. The Gospel text of today ends with a question asked by Jesus: "And yet, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?" To answer affirmatively, we must be ready to profess a faith like that of the persistent widow. We need to be like Moses and Joshua and not give up or give in even when we imagine that we are fighting a losing battle. We need to take to heart the exhortation of Paul to Timothy, to persevere in the face of all odds. God bless us.
