## World Mission Sunday, a new Homelessness Project, George Weigel Lecture at Oscott

### **This Sunday, 23 October, is World Mission Sunday**

World Mission Sunday – the one day in the year when the entire global Church comes together in support of mission.

Coordinated by Missio, the Pope's charity for world mission, World Mission Sunday is an opportunity to support every mission diocese and faith community which need our help.

It is one of only three annual Papal collections and has been especially chosen by the Holy Father to support the mission of our Church via Missio.

### **Homeless Project will find new home at St Catherine's Church, Birmingham**

A leading homeless project in Birmingham will open a brand new location at St Catherine of Sienna Church in the new year.

Tabor Living, which runs two Digbeth-based accommodation projects for rough sleepers in partnership with Father Hudson's Care will see its capacity doubled with further support for the city's homeless community introduced.

Tabor Living currently runs an eight-bedroom shelter and three-bedroom move-on facility. As the organisation

reaches its fifth anniversary this autumn, it is set to relocate its emergency accommodation into part of the city centre parish church.

Tabor Living, alongside Father Hudson's Care, will be working with St Catherine of Sienna Church, leasing part of the site to relocate and expand its services. This will include emergency and move-on accommodation for up to 18 rough sleepers in need of support off the streets and people who have experienced or are at risk of homelessness. New community, activity and meetings areas are being created as part of this exciting new project.

## **George Weigel Lecture- To Sanctify the World: The Vital Legacy of Vatican II**

George Weigel, Catholic theologian and one of America's leading public intellectuals, will be giving a public lecture at St Mary's College, Oscott on his latest (soon to be released) publication, *To Sanctify the World: The Vital Legacy of Vatican II* as part of a UK tour.

Weigel argues that, as the civilizational crisis that the Council addressed continues today, Vatican II's proposals for an authentic humanism remain crucial for the renewal of world culture and critical to the Church's mission to sanctify the world.

RISING is a unique three way partnership between Coventry University, Coventry Cathedral and the City Council.
