# Next Sunday's Mass Readings

2 Maccabees 7: 1-2, 9-14; Psalm 16; 2 Thessalonians 2: 16 - 3: 5; Luke 20: 27-38 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

The only Gospel that people read is the gospel of ourselves. People notice very easily the gospel that we live every day. In the Gospel reading today we see Zacchaeus writes a new gospel himself, the gospel of conversion. This is one of the most beautiful stories of conversion. Luke tells that Zacchaeus was not an ordinary tax collector but was a wealthy man, of course he became wealthy by unfair means. Knowing that Jesus was passing by, Zacchaeus wanted to see Jesus, not that he wanted to follow Jesus, but out of curiosity. That means, there is a longing in every person to see God and experience Him. This interior longing is innate to every human person and has been instilled in each one of us from the very first moment of our life.

Jesus entered the city of Jericho and was passing by the town. Knowing this, Zacchaeus climbed on the Sycamore tree so that he can see Jesus, at the same time he thought Jesus would not see him because he had guilt feeling of his sin. When we live in sin, we will not be able to see God, because our vision of eternal life gets blurred in our confused state of mind where we can never encounter God face to face and so we try to hide. But in the stillness of our heart, we would certainly be able to experience God, so we need to keep ourselves away from the noisy and wicked world and get closer to God. Zacchaeus in spite of his wealth and the pleasures and the comfort provided by them was apparently unhappy, empty and lonely in his heart without God. Even though he had everything, at the end of the day there was a vacuum in his life. Nothing in this world could fill that vacuum. It would be interesting to know how did Jesus know that Zacchaeus was on the tree. Had they met in a coffee shop before? Jesus called Zacchaeus by name and he posed a question to him, "Are you willing to come down from your tree of sinfulness?" And Zacchaeus agreed to come down from the tree of his worldliness and follow the master who is the way, the truth and the life. – John 14:6.

Once he encountered Jesus, Zacchaeus decided to improve his relationship with one another and to restore his relationship with God. When he desired to meet Jesus, Jesus expressed his decision to stay with him that day. This attitude of change saved Zacchaeus and that would bring the message of salvation to his whole household. Zacchaeus was a true son of Abraham, a spiritual son. Jesus is the one who seeks and saves the lost. He is the one who sought out Zacchaeus. Zacchaeus put himself in a position to see Jesus. Jesus by his gentle gesture touched the heart of Zacchaeus to receive him. Only after Zacchaeus accepted Jesus, did Jesus save him. Unless we accept Jesus as our master and Lord, he cannot take us along. We need to expose ourselves to be noted by God. In the case of Israelites, though they had heard the good news all did not accept it. Zacchaeus had heard about Jesus from others. He was eager to meet him, and he took the necessary steps to encounter the Lord, and Jesus responded to fulfil Zacchaeus' wish. So only if we preach about Jesus to others, through our own gospel of life, like Zacchaeus, can we hear about Jesus. As St. Paul says in Rom 10:16-17, "Faith comes from what is heard, and what is heard comes by the preaching of Christ". Therefore, the preaching comes from what is seen and experienced. Let us ask the Lord to have heart longing for him.
