Next Sunday's Mass Readings Malachi 3: 19-20; Psalm 97; 2 Thessalonians 3: 7 -12; Luke 21: 5-19 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

The Scriptures today remind us that there is life after death. When Jesus tells us that at death, we leave the land of the dying and go into the land of the living, none of us can say, "Yes I know - I've been there, done that" - but He can say that He conquered death.

Human person consists of body and soul, in which the body belongs to this earth and the soul belongs to the creator. Every religion on earth believes that the life here on earth is very brief and after this brief life we must leave our bodies here on earth and we travel back to where we all came from. At the same time, they all agree that after this brief life on earth ended, we enter into an everlasting life. In fact, the ultimate goal of every religion is to help people attain this goal. As Christians we are certain about this that we all come from God and unto Him we all shall return. In today's Gospel we hear that the Sadducees did not believe in the resurrection. For them, there is no life after death. Jesus disagreed with them and concluded by saying, "God is the God of the living; not of the dead,". We are sure of this because it is Jesus who is the author of our life, reassuring us that we have a much better life awaiting after this brief life ended. This belief was even prevalent in the Old Testament. The heroic action of the 7 brothers in the first reading from the book of Maccabees is a clear evidence for this belief. If they did not believe in a life after death, they would not have given away their beautiful life for the sake of the law.

Like the Sadducees in the Gospel, we can see many people today live as if there is no life after death. So today they eat and drink and make merry because tomorrow we may die. But for us Christians it is not so. We live our life today meaningfully, according to the way our Lord Jesus taught us, because tomorrow we may have to leave our bodies with all its possessions here on earth and go back to where we all came from. Therefore, we need to work not merely for our body but for our soul which is designed to be internal. That is why Jesus says in the Gospel "The children of this world take wives and husbands, but those who are judged worthy of a place in the other world and in the resurrection from the dead do not marry because they can no longer die, for they are the same as the angels" (Luke 20:24-25). Because after our death we do not have a body as of earth, but a glorified body as of Jesus after His resurrection which does not need the things that of this world.

Therefore, we have to remind ourselves of the crucial fact that our soul is immortal, that it will be united to our physical body at the end of time, that the union of our body and soul has an eternal destiny. Everything which we undertake in this life ought to be oriented to this momentous truth: We belong to God completely, soul and body, flesh and bones, all our senses and faculties (St. Josemaria, Friends of God, 111). St. Cyril of Jerusalem exhorts us: "Respect your body since it is your good fortune to be a temple of the Holy Spirit. Do not stain your body..., and if perchance you have stained it, purify it right away through penance. Clean it while you still have time (St. Cyril of Jerusalem, Catechesis, IV, 25). Our body is destined to give glory to God once it is united with our soul. Let us then glorify God in our body in this life so that in the end, with God's mercy, it will resurrect and be united with our soul, to give glory to God for eternity. God bless you.
