### Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Isaiah 11: 1-10;

Psalm 71;

Romans 15: 4-9;

Matthew 3: 1-12

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

We are in the first Sunday of Advent. After a tumultuous year, there is comfort to be found when we pause to read, pray, and reflect over the course of the Advent season, in which believers eagerly anticipate the celebration of Christ's birth. On this Sunday, the Liturgy gives us the opportunity to centre our thoughts on the virtue of hope. It's a beautiful chance to remember the hope God offers to our world which is desperately hungering for meaning in life, and that is given to us through Jesus.

The word "Advent" comes from the Latin word adventus, which means "coming." Advent in the 4th and 5th centuries was a time of preparation for the baptism of new Christians. Christians would spend 40 days in prayer and fasting to prepare for the celebration that accompanied the baptism of new believers. Over time, advent was connected to the coming of Christ. Originally Christians used this term to reference Christ's second coming, but by the Middle Ages, Advent was connected to Christ's first coming that we celebrate at Christmas. The tradition for the First Sunday of Advent includes lighting the candle of hope. This candle of hope symbolizes promises delivered through the prophets from God as well as the hope we have in Christ. God drafted a great rescue plan for the fallen humanity from slavery of sin to the freedom of life that He lays out in Scripture. This plan foretells years in advance the arrival of Christ. The Gospel reading today gives us a glimpse of the future and promises that God will come down to create a new Heaven and Earth. Today we read, pray, and reflect on the hope God's plan gives us (foretold by the prophets and fulfilled by the life and death of Christ), and we meditate on the promise of Christ's coming glory-filled return. Paul in his epistles to Galatians, articulates so perfectly the great hope we celebrate at Christmas! Without God's intervention, we were all slaves...bound up by our sin nature and hopelessly headed to the grave. Because of God's great love for us, He came down and rescued humanity by sending his Son as a sacrifice for our sin - so we could be free from the chains of sin and become fully part of God's glorious eternal family.

Therefore dear brothers and sisters, as we begin the season of Advent, as we prepare our hearts to celebrate Jesus' arrival as a gift to all humanity; let's stir up in our hearts and homes a sense of anticipation. Over this Advent, we pray that hope would rise up in our spirits in a tangible and life-giving way. So let this be our prayer all through this advent season "Father, let your hope arise in our hearts! Lift our eyes up to see that you alone are where our hope comes from. Help us to shake off the anxiety, discouragements, and distractions that have filled this year and give us the grace we need to wrap up this year joyfully".
