## Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Isaiah 52: 7-10; Psalm 97; Hebrews 1: 1-6:

John 1: 1-18

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

On this Fourth Sunday of Advent, the anticipation is building for the fast-approaching celebration of Christmas. Today's readings indicate that anticipation. The first reading from the Prophet Isaiah speaks of the coming of the Messiah. Written centuries before the birth of Christ, it tells us that the Messiah would come from Bethlehem. He would not only be the "ruler in Israel," as David was, but would rule the entire world, his kingship shall bring peace.

In the Gospel of Matthew, we hear the account of the Visitation of Mary to her cousin Elizabeth. Mary's journey to Elizabeth immediately followed the Annunciation when she learned that she would give birth to the Messiah. Scripture tells us that she went "in haste" to see Elizabeth, who was in her sixth month of pregnancy with John the Baptist. It must have been a hard journey for Mary to travel from Nazareth to the hill country of Judah, traveling about 90 miles in 4 days on foot or on donkey to meet Elizabeth. Even today with modern roads and transportation it is a hard journey to the house of Zachariah and Elizabeth. It is incredible to think of what this encounter must have been like. Here are two women who have been called by God to bring forth children into the world who would transform history. John would lead the way for the Messiah, Jesus, who would save us from our sins. Upon Mary's arrival, John the Baptist leaped in Elizabeth's womb as an expression of acknowledgement of the presence of the Lord, Jesus, in Mary's womb. Elizabeth articulates this with the familiar words we say in the "Hail, Mary": "Blessed are you among women and blessed is the fruit of your womb." She also referred to Mary as "the mother of my Lord." Thus, Elizabeth expressed faith that Jesus was the Messiah. This meeting was an encounter of two women chosen by God to be His instruments to bring forth Messiah the Saviour. This leads us to an important reflection on Mary's role in God's bringing of salvation to the world. God chose to become man in order to save us from our sins. But He did not force Himself into humanity. He did not disrespect our human freedom in order to do so. Rather, He invited Mary to be the mother of the Messiah. And because she said 'yes,' God became incarnate. Therefore, we can echo the words of Elizabeth in saying, "Blessed are you who believed that what was spoken to you by the Lord would be fulfilled." Mary trusted God, even though what she was entrusted with was beyond comprehension and thus she became the new Ark of the Covenant, the Tabernacle, the 'God Bearer' as St. John Paul II once said, "Mary became in some way a 'tabernacle' the first 'tabernacle' in history in which the Son of God, still invisible to the human gaze, allowed himself to be adored by Elizabeth, radiating His peace and joy at His very presence".

Every Christian is called to be Christophers (Christ Bearer) who bear His image, invisible and visibly radiating Christ's peace and Joy to everybody we meet. That means the very presence of a Christian should make others leap with joy and peace. Over this Advent, would you pray that God's unexplainable peace would be evident in your heart and home. This year we all have faced so many challenges and uncertainties. God's peace is something we need to grab tightly onto more than ever. May God's spirit transform the days leading up to Christmas into a time to joyfully await our King!
