

### Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Isaiah 42: 1-4, 6-7; Psalm 28; Acts 10: 34-38;

Matthew 3: 13-17

Dear Brothers and Sisters, today we celebrate the Solemnity of Mary the Mother of God. One might ask a question, Mary is only a creature, so how can she be the Mather of God? It is a legitimate question. In order to answer this question, we need to understand what motherhood implies. Motherhood is an act of a woman giving her offspring the same type of nature that she herself has. This gift of nature is given through the process of conception, growth and childbirth. The fruit of this process, which we may call as maternal generation of the whole person, not only the physical body but the complete person. For example, our own mother, who is the mother of the complete person as we are. Even though our own mother does not create our soul which is infused in us by God himself. Motherhood therefore refers to the gift of like nature including the entire nature of a person. Mary is the mother of Jesus; Jesus is God therefore Mary is the Mother of God. In Jesus there is only one person, the divine person but two natures divine and human. Mary did not give Jesus his divine nature, which was His from all eternity. She also did not give Jesus His human soul. Mary gave Jesus a human nature. However, in Jesus, both human nature and the divine nature united in one person, the second person in the trinity without any confusion or division. Since in Jesus there is only one person that is divine, therefore Mary is rightly called as Mother of God. To say the same thing in another way. A woman is a man's mother either if she carried him in her womb or if she was the woman contributing half of his genetic matter or both. Mary is the mother of Jesus in both senses because she not only carried Jesus in her womb but also supplied all the genetic matter for His human body since it was through her not through Joseph that Jesus took His full human nature.

St. Paul points out that the Son of God was "born of a woman" (Gal 4:4). In these few words, he tells us something amazing: that the Lord was born like us. He did not appear on the scene as an adult, but as a child. He came into the world not on his own, but from a woman, after nine months in the womb of his Mother, from whom he allowed his humanity to be shaped. The heart of the Lord began to beat within Mary; the God of life drew oxygen from her. Ever since then, Mary has united us to God because in her God bound himself to our flesh, and he has never left it. She is not only the bridge joining us to God; she is the road that God travelled in order to reach us, and the road that we must travel in order to reach him. Through Mary, we encounter God the way he wants us to: in tender love, in intimacy, in the flesh. Jesus is not an abstract idea; he is real and incarnate; he was "born of a woman", and quietly grew. Women are concrete and know how to weave life's threads with quiet patience. How many women, how many mothers, thus give birth and rebirth to life, offering the world a future! We are in this world not to die, but to give life. The holy Mother of God teaches us that the first step in giving life to those around us is to cherish it within ourselves. Today's Gospel tells us that Mary "kept all these things in her heart" (cf. Lk 2:19). And goodness comes from the heart. How important it is to keep our hearts pure, to cultivate our interior life and to persevere in our prayer! How important it is to educate our hearts to care, to cherish the persons and things around us. Everything starts from this: from cherishing others, the world and creation. This year, while we hope for new beginnings and new cares, let us not neglect care. This will be a good year if we take care of others, as Our Lady does with us. It would be good to find time for someone. Let us ask for the grace to find time for God and for our neighbour for those who are alone or suffering, for those who need someone to listen and show concern for them. Have a Blessed New Year 2023.
