Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Isaiah 49: 3, 5-6; Psalm 39; 1 Corinthians 1: 1-3; John 1: 29-34 Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

The Feast of the Baptism of the Lord ends the Christmas season. The Church's long tradition, this feast is always celebrated after the Feast of the Epiphany of the Lord, which we celebrated last Friday, and close to the miracle at Cana where Jesus turned water into wine. In each of these events, the life and the mission of Jesus is clearly made known. St. Matthew tells us that during the Baptism of Jesus the Heavens were opened and a voice came, "This is my beloved Son with whom I am well pleased". It is interesting that for a baby who was born in a simple manger on a quiet night, all these years later having a dramatic baptism. Christmas begins with a silent night, but it ends with God's voice booming in the sky saying that how He is pleased with His Beloved Son. What is happening at the Baptism of Jesus is the proclamation that Jesus, seemingly a man like all of us, is in reality so closely at one with God that God calls Him His Beloved Son and revels the presence of the Holy Spirit who is always with Him. The baptism of Jesus is a confirmation of what Luke's Gospel has already told us, that Jesus is not another, but He is the presence among us.

On this day we focus on the extraordinary events that took place during the time of baptism of the Lord. During His baptism the Heavens were opened. It was opened for Jesus. The Gospel of St. John tells that Jesus would speak about Himself as The Bread that has come down from Heaven, the word made flesh. The heavens were closed and God sent men out of the Garden of Eden after their fall. The Garden of Eden symbolises heaven itself. St. Paul in his letter to the Romans uses the Adam-Christ typology, Christ as the new Adam. Through this new Adam the door that was closed but by the sin of first Adam was opened. So, in the same way, during our baptism the door of the heavenly kingdom is opened for us and at our baptism we have began our journey towards heaven. Just as Jesus was entrusted with a mission after His baptism, so we, after our own baptism are called to imitate Christ in our Heavenward Journey here on earth. On the one hand through baptism, we are privileged to be called God's chosen sons and daughters, a people set apart and sealed with his Holy Spirit, but on the other hand, we are also called to show forth this fact in our lives through our imitation of Christ. Seen in this manner, our baptism is not merely an event that occurred years ago and once for all but is a daily dying and rising to new life. It is a call to respond daily with life to the numerous deaths that take place around us. It is a call to respond with courage and hope to the fear and despair that is around us. Everyday we are called to be a sign of what we have already received.

Sadly, for some, the Sacrament of Baptism which is the gateway to heaven becomes just another theoretical expression of our faith and an easy gateway to Catholic schools. We do not live this out in our lives. This is possibly why after the baptism of his baby brother in church, little Johnny sobbed all the way home in the back seat of the car. His father asked him three times what was wrong. Finally, Johnny replied, "That priest said he wanted us brought up in a Christian home, but I want to stay with you." John F Kennedy's famous saying can be amended to read, "Ask not what your Church can do for you; rather, ask what you must do for your Church." "Have I ever missed the right gate?"
