Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Isaiah 8: 23 - 9: 3;

Psalm 26;

1 Corinthians 1:

10-13, 17;

Matthew 4: 12-23

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

On this second Sunday of Ordinary time, in the 1st reading the prophet Isaiah 49:3,5-6 foretells us that Christ is the light of the nations that has come to rescue us from the darkness of our sins: "I will make you a light to the nations, that my salvation may reach to the ends of the earth". Last Sunday we heard Matthew's account of Jesus' baptism, on the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Today, we hear John the Baptist's testimony about Jesus as found in John's Gospel. In today's reading, John the Baptist sees Jesus approaching and cries out, giving witness about who Jesus is. In John's testimony he says that he saw the Spirit descend upon Jesus. By this sign, John the Baptist knew that Jesus was the one who is to come after him. John the Baptist uses two titles for Jesus that are familiar to us. John calls Jesus the "Lamb of God" and the "Son of God." By using these titles, John the Baptist identifies Jesus' ultimate purpose: to redeem sinful humanity. His testimony about Jesus clearly distinguishes John's baptism from the Baptism that Jesus will inaugurate. John baptizes with water; Jesus will baptize with the Holy Spirit. John also puts his practice of baptism in the context of Jesus' ministry. The purpose of John's baptism was to make Jesus known to Israel.

John the Baptist's sense of purpose is clearly identified in this reading: he baptized in order to prepare for and make known the ministry of the One who was to follow. John's witness is an excellent example of what it means to be a disciple. By our Baptism, we are called to make Jesus known to all the world by our words and by the witness of our lives. As Christians, fulfilling God's Will must always be our principal concern if we are to follow faithfully Our Lord Jesus Christ. We pray it daily in the Lord's Prayer: Thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. At times, fulfilling His Will is not that easy neither to understand nor to carry out, but what is important is our firm faith and conviction that God always knows and wants what is best for us. Also, we should avoid the temptation of trying to comprehend everything for we shouldn't have to nor would we be capable of doing so with our limited capacity. That is why faith is necessary. Otherwise, there is no need for it. Jesus fulfilled the Will of God the Father until the end. St. John call him the "Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world" (Jn 1:29-34), Prophet Isaiah had compared the sufferings of the Servant of Yahweh, the Messiah, with the sacrifice of a lamb (cf. Is 53:7); and the blood of the paschal lamb smeared on the doors of houses had served to protect the firstborn of the Israelites in Egypt (cf. Ex 12:6-7): all this was a promise and prefiguring of the true Lamb, Christ, the victim in the Sacrifice of Calvary on behalf of all mankind. This is why St Paul will say that "Christ, our paschal lamb, has been sacrificed" (1 Cor 5:7). The expression "Lamb of God" also suggests the spotless innocence of the Redeemer (1 Pet 1:18-20; 1 Jn 3:5).

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ, let us thank Our Lord Jesus Christ for fulfilling God's Will out of love for us and for our salvation, with a total obedience, the holocaust of an innocent, spotless and sinless victim to save the sinfulness and ingratitude of mankind, without any complaint. If God grants us the grace to suffer with Him, let us remember that Christ preceded us to give us an example to follow. And in the midst of our grief, suffering, pain brought about by great and small trials in our life, as St. Michael did let us tell Our Lord: "Here I am lord; I come to do your will" Fr.
