Stick to the Friday fast, or if you already do this, reduce your meat consumption each week.

A recent study from the University of Cambridge found that one quarter of Catholics observed the Friday abstinence from meat. This translates into a saving of 55000 tons of carbon per year. If all Catholics did this, we would be saving 220 000 tons each year. If we all had a second meat free day, that could be 440 000 tons saved

LIVE SUSTAINABLY
