THE DIOCESAN VISION: UNFOLDING GOD'S PLAN FOR THE PARISH

As part of Unfolding God's Plan for our Diocese and the Parish with the Diocesan Vision, we had our first session last Wednesday. Around 20 people attended the session and they all felt that these sessions are very much needed for the overall growth of our parish. So, in continuation of this, another five sessions have been designed to help more parishioners, parish leaders and small groups to engage with the Vision and think about how we can take practical steps to renew the mission and ministries within the parish. We invite more parishioners and parish groups to come along in a friendly manner to reflect and discuss about our parish life in line with the Diocesan Vision. The second and third sessions will be on **Wednesday 22nd March and Wednesday 29th March** at 7.00 pm in the Parish Hall. The remaining 3 sessions will follow after Easter. Each session will start with an opening prayer, excerpt from the Diocesan Vision document, short reflection, questions/activities and conclusion. The sessions will be 90 minutes each.

After the service priests from the deanery will be available to listen to individual confessions. Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Ezekial 37: 12-14; Psalm 129;

Romans 8: 8-11;

John 11: 1-45

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

We are on the 4th Sunday of Lent. We crossed halfway through the Lenten journey. What are our experiences of the Lenten journey so far? How far have we reached with the spiritual preparation to celebrate Our Lord's Resurrection? As we celebrate today Laetare Sunday, meaning, rejoice, the liturgy calls us to rejoice in the Lord as we move closer to the celebration of the Easter. As we continue our spiritual preparation, through prayer, abstinence and works of charity - the spiritual pillars of lent, the liturgy of the word today invites us to introspect ourselves and make a paradigm shift from our spiritual blindness to the life of Christ's light. We can see when we see with our eyes but when we fail to see with our hearts, we become spiritually blind. Therefore, we are invited to put on the mind and heart of Jesus Christ to see life as He sees.

In the first reading, from the book of Samuel, the Lord instructs Prophet Samuel not to look at external appearances in the process of anointing a King for the Israelites. He exhorts Samuel to anoint David - a small, shepherd boy, the youngest son of Jesse, as the first king of Israel and the Spirit of the Lord shall be poured upon David from that day forward so that he will rule the people of Israel with God's wisdom and grace. The manner in which David was chosen to be the king reminds us that, God looks at the heart of the person, not the external appearance. My dear friends this how the Lord works. The Lord sees not as man sees and His ways are not our ways.

In the Gospel according to John 9: 1-14, we see the personal encounter of the blind man with Jesus. Last Sunday we saw the Samaritan woman had a similar personal encounter at the well of Jacob and she recognized Jesus as the Messiah the Anointed One as the source of Living Water. Jesus anoints the eyes of the blind man with a New Sight - a sight to see from the heart with positive outlook with the same vision as Jesus would see. Remember, both Jesus and the blind man had to face criticism from the Pharisees and others because of their spiritual blindness and their reluctance to see truth even though it was clear as in the day light. They failed to see goodness in others because they themselves were living in darkness of spiritual pride and mere observance of the Law, without looking at the essence of the Law to which it was intended to. Jesus Christ the anointed, anoints the eyes of the blind man with a new and deep sight to see the beauty of God's creation from new angle which had changed the entire life of the blind man.

My dear friends, as we continue our Lenten journey, we pray to Christ the Anointed One, to anoint us once again with His Holy Spirit and heal us from our spiritual blindness. May we become more positive in our outlook towards life, appreciate the goodness in others and thus become a source of Light to enlighten those who still live in darkness. Let us pray, that as we celebrate the Laetare Sunday today, may this celebration facilitate us spiritually with more reasons to rejoice in the Lord always as the disciples of Jesus Christ.
