THE DIOCESAN VISION: UNFOLDING GOD'S PLAN FOR THE PARISH

As part of Unfolding God's Plan for our Diocese and the Parish with the Diocesan Vision, we had our first session last Wednesday. Around 20 people attended the session and they all felt that these sessions are very much needed for the overall growth of our parish. So, in continuation of this, another five sessions have been designed to help more parishioners, parish leaders and small groups to engage with the Vision and think about how we can take practical steps to renew the mission and ministries within the parish. We invite more parishioners and parish groups to come along in a friendly manner to reflect and discuss about our parish life in line with the Diocesan Vision. The third session will be on **Wednesday 29th March** at 7.00 pm in the Parish Hall. The remaining 3 sessions will follow after Easter. Each session will start with an opening prayer, excerpt from the Diocesan Vision document, short reflection, questions/activities and conclusion. The sessions will be 90 minutes each.

Next Sunday's Mass Readings

Isaiah 50: 4-7; Psalm 21;

Philippians 2: 6-11; Matthew 26: 14 -

27: 66

Welcome to everyone at Mass today, especially if you are new to our church or haven't been to Mass for some time. If you are of another Christian denomination or non-Christian you are warmly invited to approach the priest or minister and ask or signify your wish for a blessing.

Why do we keep visiting the old and infirm and those in hospitals when we have no miracle drug to take away their pain? Why do we commit ourselves to the political process when there is so much cynicism and a malaise of despair in the political system today? Why does the Church, through her priests, religious and laity, continue to reach out to those in need despite the tremendous opposition by vested interests and the attempts at destruction of those works by those who cannot bear to see the poor get their due and rights? The prime reason is because we continue to believe that God is still in charge, and so we hope that with his help we will overcome. In the first reading we see Prophet Ezekiel felt puzzled, when the Lord challenged him to see, that He would open the graves of the dead of Israel and restore them to life again. Yet, the Lord did indeed act in accord with his word and life was restored. Death - the absence of the breath of God's spirit - was transformed to life by the life-giving spirit of God. He continued to give hope and communicated this hope to all of Israel. Even in exile in Babylon, Israel must not give in to despair, but hope.

Martha, the sister of Lazarus, despite her verbal acceptance of Jesus as the Resurrection and the Life, did not expect that her brother would be raised and brought back to life again. This is why when Jesus asks for the stone to be removed from the tomb, her focus is on the smell of death. As He stood by the tomb of Lazarus, Jesus was in great distress because the people did not believe that he, who stood among them, was *The Source of Life*. Also realising that which sin and death had done to humanity. Sin and death succeeded in robbing humanity of hope. Physical death is indeed difficult to accept, but it surely is not the end. Thus, we are not asked not to weep over the death, but only not to give in to despair, not to lose hope.

How painful our current circumstances, and how agonizing our honest questions about job loss, wayward children, financial disaster, chronic sickness, destruction of human life in still birth or after birth. But Christian faith believes that God in Christ will conquer and transform even death, the ultimate enemy. Paul's letter to the Romans talks about the same Spirit of God that gives life. He explains that the same Spirit that raised Jesus from the dead lives in us and is responsible for giving us life. As we near the end of Lent, we are being reminded that God's Spirit is the source of our life as a community. We are not only being prepared for Christ's resurrection but our own too. We need to choose to live as Jesus lived. We can live our call to be a community of faith focused on the strength of our unity. The choice rests with us.
